It is recommended that you:

- sign the attached Minutes of Meeting of Trustees for the meeting of the Trustees which launches the Premier's Disaster Relief Appeal to assist victims affected by extensive flooding in Queensland in December 2010 and early 2011 (Attachment 1)
- sign the letter to the Minister for Police, Corrective Services and Emergency Services (as Trustee) seeking his signature on the *Minutes of Meeting of Trustees* (Attachment 2)
- agree that the Queensland Government will commence the Appeal with a \$1M contribution

• KEY ISSUES

- Under the Trust Deed for the Premier's Disaster Relief Appeal Fund (Trust Deed), two Trustees constitute a quorum for the purpose of transacting business of the Trust and that meetings and business of the Trust shall be held at the times and places and conducted in such a manner as the Trustees determine.
- The Trustees of the fund are you, the Treasurer and the Minister for Emergency Services. You and the other trustees have agreed to commence an appeal to accept gifts of money for the purpose of relieving the suffering of the victims affected by extensive flooding in Queensland in December 2010 and early 2011.
- The attached Minutes of Meeting of Trustees provide an official record of the Trustees' decision to commence the appeal and to select the Australian Red Cross Queensland as the disbursement agency (Attachment 1).
- The Queensland Government will make an initial contribution of \$1M to commence the Appeal and a co-contribution will be sought from the Commonwealth Government. The Queensland contribution will initially be sourced from my reserve.
- Donations will be collected via a free call phone number, which will be manned by Smart Services Queensland. Action is also being taken seeking the agreement of the major banks to also accept donation on behalf of the Appeal.
- It is proposed that letters be sent to all donors contributing to the Premier's Disaster Relief Appeal, to acknowledge their generosity. All donations of \$10 000 and over will be identified and your signature will be sought on letters acknowledging these contributions.

As you would be aware, Queenslan

As you would be aware, Queensland has suffered extensive flooding across most of the State following ex Tropical Cyclone Tasha crossing the coast on Christmas morning and subsequently developing into a monsoonal rain depression.

The full consequences and the extent of damage will not be known until the flood waters fully recede. 

It is recommended that you:

- sign the Trust Deed (attachment one) to establish the Queensland Floods Disaster Relief Fund (the Fund); and
- endorse the attached Resolutions (attachment two) to establish the Queensland Floods Disaster Relief Fund Distribution Committee, delegate power to the Committee to distribute funds, and ratify related governance mechanisms.

KEY ISSUES

- The existing Premier's Disaster Relief Appeal Fund only enables money to be transferred to a charitable institution or a body with deductible gift recipient status.
- Creation of the new Fund is required to facilitate payments to individuals. This is the same process that was used for the Cyclone Larry Disaster Relief Fund.
- To expedite payments from the Fund, it is proposed that the Distribution Committee be delegated the power to take necessary action to disburse assistance on behalf of yourself and the other Trustees.
- The attached Resolutions also enables the department's Chief Financial Officer to transfer collections made into the exiting Premiers' Disaster Relief fund into the newly established Fund.
- The Distribution Committee is finalising its proposal for the first funding round to assist people whose principal place of residence has been rendered uninhabitable with flooding above the level of the floor.
- It is anticipated that Centrelink will perform the assessment function for the first round of funding in consultation with the Department of Communities to confirm inundation above the floor.
- The Committee will report regularly to the Trustees on payments from the Fund.



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THIS TRUST DEED is made

BY **ANNA MARIA BLIGH**, the Premier and Minister for the Arts of Queensland

ANDREW PETER FRASER, the Treasurer and Minister for Employment and AND

Economic Development of Queensland

NEIL STUART ROBERTS, the Minister for Police, Corrective Services and AND **Emergency Services of Queensland**

(in this Trust Deed, each an "Initial Trustee")

BACKGROUND:

- The Government of Queensland wishes to establish and maintain a public fund to provide A. relief (including by way of assistance to re-establish a community) to people who are in distress as a result of the Disaster.
- B. The Trustees propose to solicit and accept gifts, or as the case may be appropriations, of money from the general public, industry, the State of Queensland, the Commonwealth, any other State or Territory of the Commonwealth of Australia, any Commonwealth, State or Territory authority or instrumentality, or any other appropriate sources (including, without limitation, Ancillary Funds), in order to apply that money for the purposes set out in this Trust Deed.

THE TRUSTEES DECLARE AS FOLLOWS:

INTERPRETATION 1.

- In this Deed, except where the contrary intention appears: 1.1
 - "Ancillary Fund" means a public fund that is endorsed as a deductible gift recipient under item 2 of the table in section 30-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 (Cth);
 - "Commencement Date" means the date of execution of this Deed;
 - "Deed" means this Trust Deed, as amended or varied from time to time;
 - "Disaster" means the widespread flooding in Queensland in the areas covered by disaster situations declared under the Disaster Management Act 2003 (Qld) in December 2010 and January 2011, being a disaster that satisfies the requirements of subsection 30-46(1) of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 (Cth), namely:
 - it was declared to be a disaster, or gave rise to a declaration of a state of emergency, by or with the approval of a Minister of a State or Territory under the law of the State or Territory; and
 - it developed rapidly; and

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- (c) it resulted in the death, serious injury or other physical suffering of a large number of people, or in widespread damage to property or the natural environment;
- **"Fund"** means the public fund known as "2010/2011 Queensland Floods Disaster Relief Fund", and includes:
- (a) the Original Sum;
- (b) gifts and appropriations of money or property paid or contributed to the Fund, whether pursuant to a specific public appeal or otherwise, and whether paid or contributed before or after the date of this Deed; and
- (c) all accretions to the Fund;
- (d) all accumulations of income; and
- (e) the money, investments and property which from time to time any accumulation of income authorised by this Deed, and includes any monies paid before and after the date of this Deed into the Fund;
- "Gift Fund" has the meaning set out in clause 4;
- "Objects" means the objects specified in clause 2;
- "Original Sum" means the sum of \$10 which constitutes the Fund at the Commencement Date, and which amount has been paid into the Fund by or on behalf of the Director-General of the Department of The Premier and Cabinet on or before the Commencement Date;
- "Public Person" means any natural person acceptable to the Australian Taxation Office who, because of their tenure of a public office or their position in the community, has a degree of responsibility to the community as a whole;
- "Trust" means the trust as constituted by clause 2 of this Deed;
- "Trustees" means:
- (a) subject to clause 10.2, the Initial Trustees; and
- (b) any Trustee appointed pursuant to clause 10.3;
- "Trusts Act" means the Trusts Act 1973 (Qld).
- 1.2 In this Deed, except where the contrary intention appears:
 - (a) words importing a gender include any other gender;
 - (b) words in the singular include the plural and vice versa;
 - (c) all dollar amounts refer to Australian currency;
 - (d) a reference to any legislation includes any subordinate legislation made under it and any legislation amending, consolidating or replacing it;
 - (e) a reference to an individual or person includes a corporation or other legal entity;

- (f) the index and clause headings have been included for convenience of reference only and are not intended to affect the meaning or interpretation of this Deed;
- (g) if an expression is defined, other grammatical forms of that expression have a corresponding meaning; and
- (h) if the day on or by which any matter or thing to be done under this Deed is a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday in the place where the matter or thing is to be done, the matter or thing may be done on the next Business Day.

2. OBJECTS OF TRUST

2.1 The Trustees declare that they hold the Fund upon trust solely for charitable purposes involving the provision of money for the relief (including relief by way of assistance to re-establish a community) of people in Australia in distress as a result of the Disaster.

3. COMMENCEMENT OF THE TRUST

3.1 The Trust will commence on and from the date of execution of this Deed.

4. GIFT FUND

4.1 The Trustees will, where both deductible gifts and contributions as well as non-deductible gifts and contributions are made to the Fund, establish and maintain separate gift fund ("Gift Fund").

5. INVESTMENT OF THE FUND

- 5.1 The Trustees have the power to invest all or any part of the Fund in any manner authorised by law for the investment of trust funds and any income which accrues from such investment will be held upon the trusts as set out in this Deed.
- 5.2 The Trustees are not responsible for any loss suffered by the Trust or the Fund as a result of the exercise of the Trustees' powers under clause 5.1.

6. THE FUND

6.1 The Fund will include any investment from time to time representing the Fund or any unexpended residue of the Fund and will also include any accumulation of income, which is authorised by this Deed.

7. RECEIPTS

- 7.1 The Trustees will issue tax deductible receipts showing the name of the recipient as "2010/2011 Queensland Floods Disaster Relief Fund".
- 7.2 The Australian Business Number of the Trust or Fund (as applicable) and the fact that the receipt is for a gift will be shown on receipts issued.

8. WINDING-UP OF THE TRUST OR FUND

8.1 If the Trustees determine that the Trust has become impracticable or that it is inexpedient to carry on the Trust or that this Deed has failed to accomplish its intention and purposes, the

Trustees may by resolution determine the Trust on and from the termination date specified in such resolution.

- 8.2 In the event of the Trust being wound up or dissolved, any surplus assets remaining after the payment of the liabilities of the Trust will be transferred to a fund, authority or institution which has similar objects to the Objects, and to which income tax deductible gifts can be made.
- 8.3 If the Gift Fund is wound up, or if the endorsement (if any) of the Trust as a deductible gift recipient is revoked, any surplus assets of the Gift Fund remaining after the payment of liabilities attributable to it will be transferred to a fund, authority or institution to which income tax deductible gifts can be made.

9. ADMINISTRATION EXPENSES

9.1 The Trustees may, subject to the provisions of the Trusts Act, apply the Fund towards the meeting of expenses incurred in the administration of the Trust.

10. APPOINTMENT AND REMOVAL OF TRUSTEES

- 10.1 The Trustees must be natural persons, numbering not less than three and not more than seven and each of whom must be:
 - (a) the Premier of Queensland;
 - (b) a Minister in the Government of Queensland; or
 - (c) a Public Person.
- 10.2 The position of any Trustee will become vacant if:
 - (a) that Trustee:
 - (i) dies;
 - (ii) resigns;
 - (iii) is an uncertificated or undischarged bankrupt;
 - (iv) becomes mentally ill; or
 - (v) ceases to be the Premier of Queensland or a Minister in the Government of Oueensland, or to be a Public Person; or
 - (b) the Premier of Queensland signs a certificate confirming that the Trustee concerned is removed from office as a trustee of the Trust, which certificate will be conclusive evidence that the Trustee concerned has so been removed from office.
- 10.3 Subject to clause 10.1, the Premier of Queensland from time to time, or a nominee of the Premier of Queensland from time to time (which nominee must be a Minister of the Government of Queensland), may appoint a person:
 - (a) to fill any vacancy in the position of Trustee; or

(b) as an additional Trustee.

11. QUORUM OF THE TRUSTEES

11.1 A majority of Trustees will constitute a quorum for the transaction of the business of the Trust.

12. MEETINGS OF THE TRUST

- 12.1 The Trustees may meet together, at such intervals as the Trustees think fit, for the dispatch of business, adjourn and otherwise regulate their meetings and proceedings as they think fit.
- 12.2 If there is more than one Trustee, the Trustees must act jointly.
- 12.3 The Trustees may, in writing, delegate the exercise of all or any of the powers or discretions contained in this Deed on the Trustees (including, without limitation, this power of delegation and including, without limitation, a delegation to any committee appointed by the Trustees, or to any member of the public appointed by the Trustees to assist them in performing their duties under this Deed), and execute any power of attorney or other instrument necessary to give effect to such delegation.
- 12.4 Except as provided otherwise, any exercise by the Trustees of any power, discretion or authority conferred on the Trustees by this Deed may be made:
 - (a) in writing signed by all the Trustees for the time being who are in the Commonwealth of Australia (not being less than the quorum for a meeting), which resolution may consist as several documents in like form, each signed by one or more of the Trustees; or
 - (b) by a resolution duly passed by a majority of the Trustees at a meeting of Trustees.
- 12.5 The Trustees must cause proper minutes of all resolutions and meetings to be kept and entered into a book for those purposes. Any minutes purporting to be signed by the chairperson of any meeting will be considered to be prima facie evidence of the matters stated in such minutes.

13. TRUSTEES' POWERS, RESPONSIBILITIES AND INDEMNITY

- 13.1 The Trustees, as regards all the trusts, powers, authorities and discretions vested in them by this Deed have absolute and uncontrolled discretion as to the exercise of them, whether in relation to the manner or as to the mode of and time for the exercise of them, except as expressly provided in this Deed.
- 13.2 The Trustees will manage the Fund and, in addition to and without limiting the Trustees' powers specified in this Deed, have the following powers:
 - (a) to seek gifts, donations and other contributions to the Fund;
 - (b) to manage any real and personal property of the Trust (including the Fund);
 - (c) to open and operate such bank and other accounts as the Trustees think fit;
 - (d) to vary, alter, transpose or reinvest any of the investments authorised under this Deed;
 - (e) to institute and defend proceedings at law to proceed to the final end and determination of such proceedings or compromise such proceedings;

- (f) to compromise and settle all matters arising in relation to the Trust;
- (g) to determine in their absolute discretion whether a particular amount received or derived or expense incurred should be considered as capital or income;
- (h) to raise and borrow money either with or without security or secured by mortgage or charge over all or any part of the Fund or other property (if any) of the Trust; and
- (i) to do all such other lawful acts and things as are incidental or conducive to the Objects.
- 13.3 The Trustees will not be liable for any loss which may be sustained by the Trust, unless that loss is caused by the Trustees' own deceit, neglect or default.

13.4 The Trustees:

- (a) **must** be indemnified out of the Fund from and against any expense and liability that may be incurred in prosecuting or defending any action or suit in respect of the provisions of the Deed;
- (b) are **not** responsible for any loss incurred as a result of any act, deceit, neglect, mistake or default;
- (c) will **not** be liable to account to anyone for any payments made by the Trustees in good faith to any duly empowered fiscal authority for taxes, imposts or other charges made upon or in respect of the Trust or the Fund or with respect to any transaction under this Deed notwithstanding that any such payment ought or need not have been made,
- (d) may act upon the opinion or advice obtained from persons who are professionals or experts in relation to the matters upon which they are consulted, and the Trustees are not liable for any loss arising from anything done or suffered by it in good faith in reliance upon any such opinion or advice,

except to the extent that such expense, liability, loss or payment (as the case may be) is attributable to the Trustees' own deceit, neglect or default.

- 13.5 The Trustees will not incur any liability to anyone in respect of doing or performing or failing to do or perform any act or thing which, by reason of any provision of any present or future law of any place or of any decree, order or judgement of any court of competent jurisdiction the Trustees are required to do or perform or are hindered, prevented or forbidden from doing or performing.
- 13.6 The powers given to the Trustees are exercisable by them only in a fiduciary capacity in furtherance of the public charitable purposes of the Trust as set out in the Deed and not otherwise.

14. GRANT OF ASSISTANCE BY TRUST

14.1 Grants of assistance to beneficiaries of the Trust will be subject to this Deed, the Trusts Act, and such other conditions as the Trustees may impose, and will be in the absolute discretion of the Trustees.

9.

15. ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT

- 15.1 As soon as possible after the end of each financial year, the Trustees must prepare, or cause to be prepared, financial statements showing the financial position of the Fund as at the end of the relevant financial year.
- 15.2 The Trustees must have the financial statements for the Fund audited at the end of each financial year in accordance with the obligations imposed on the Trustees by law.

16. AMENDMENT OF DEED

- 16.1 Subject to clause 16.3, the Trustees may at any time, by supplemental deed, alter, amend, vary, replace or add to any of the provisions of this Deed.
- 16.2 The Trustees will give prior notification to the Australian Taxation Office of any changes they propose to make to this Deed.
- 16.3 This Deed may not be altered, amended, varied or replaced;
 - (a) in any manner that results in, or may result in:
 - (i) any part of the Fund or the income from investment of the Fund becoming subject to any trusts other than public trusts having a purpose substantially similar to the purpose of the Trust;
 - (ii) any part of the Fund being expended for any purpose other than for the carrying out of the Objects; or
 - (iii) the Trustees being authorised to invest any part of the Fund other than in a manner which trustees are permitted to invest under the laws of Australia or of any State or Territory of Australia; or
 - (b) so as to permit this Deed to be amended in a manner prohibited by this clause 16.3.

17. FUND TO BE APPLIED SOLELY TO OBJECTS

17.1 The assets and income of the Trust will be applied solely in furtherance of its above mentioned Objects and no portion may be distributed directly or indirectly to the Trustees.

18. GENERAL

- 18.1 If any questions arise as to the construction or meaning of this Deed, the decision of the Trustees on that question will be conclusive and binding.
- 18.2 This Deed contains the entire understanding as to the subject matter contained in it. All previous agreements, representations, warranties, explanations and commitments, expressed or implied, affecting this subject matter are superseded by this Deed and have no effect.
- 18.3 A single or partial exercise or waiver of a right relating to this Deed does not prevent any other exercise of that right or the exercise of any other right.
- 18.4 This Deed is governed by and is to be construed in accordance with the laws of Queensland.

Distribution Committee Proposal

January 2011

Purpose of the Committee

It is proposed that a Distribution Committee undertakes the coordination of the distribution of the gifts collected by the Premier's Disaster Relief Appeal established to relieve the suffering and distress suffered by the victims of the widespread flooding in Queensland declared or to be declared disaster situations under the *Disaster Management Act 2003* (Qld).

The distribution of gifts to victims of this disaster will be pursuant to the 2010/2011 Queensland Floods Disaster Relief Fund.

The role of the Committee will be to oversee the distribution of funds.

The Committee will oversee the proper management and administration of the process, and acquittal of all funds expended.

Composition of the Committee and Sub-Committees (if required)

The Committee would be comprised of the following membership:

- The Honourable Dr David Hamil AM (Chairperson);
- The Honourable Robert Schwarten MP, Minister Public Works and Information and Communication Technology and State Member for Rockhampton;
- Mr Vaughan Johnson MP State Member for Gregory;
- Mr Alan Clayton, State Chairman of the Australian Red Cross, Queensland Branch:
- Cr Paul Bell, Emerald Shire Council and President of the Local Government Association of Queensland;
- Mr Jeff Whalan, Australian Government representative; and
- Mr John Gaskin, Chairman, Queensland Building Services Authority Board (also a member of the Flood Recovery Task Force).

The Committee may be supported by sub-committees, to be established at the discretion of the Committee, in the most affected areas on an as need basis.

The membership of the sub-committees will be determined by the Committee.

The role and function of sub-committees will be determined by the Committee as required.

All representatives on both the main and any sub-committees are expected to donate their services free of charge with reimbursement for actual costs.

Role of Committee

The role of the Committee is to:

- determine the criteria for distribution of funds including the quantum to each application;
- call for applications for relief funds ensuring wide publicity and ease of lodgment;
- determine the means of assessing applications;
- ensure speedy distribution of funds;
- oversee proper accountabilities of funding disbursement;
- report to the Trustees of the fund on the management and distribution of the fund; and
- other functions as determined by the Trustees (the Premier, Treasurer and Minister for Emergency Services)

Timeliness

The timeliness of distribution of funds is critical to the success of the appeal and to meet public expectations.

Successful applicants will be gifted funds as soon as possible following lodgment of an application.

Acquittal of Funds

The Committee would provide an acquittal of funds to the Trustees of the Fund at the conclusion of the process.

Costs

All administration costs associated with the distribution of the Appeal Fund will be met from the operating budget of the Department of the Premier and Cabinet to ensure that the donated funds are applied for their intended purpose of community recovery.



"this Deed" means this deed of variation; and

terms capitalised in this Deed and not otherwise defined in this Deed have the meaning given in the Trust Deed.

- 1.2 In this Deed, except where the contrary intention appears:
 - (a) words importing a gender include any other gender;
 - (b) words in the singular include the plural and vice versa;
 - (c) all dollar amounts refer to Australian currency;
 - (d) a reference to any legislation includes any subordinate legislation made under it and any

legislation amending, consolidating or replacing it;

being disasters that satisfy the requirements of subsection 30-46(1) of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 (Cth), namely:

- (e) they were declared to be disasters, or gave rise to declarations of states of emergency, by or with the approval of a Minister of a State or Territory under the law of the State or Territory; and
- (i) they developed rapidly; and



BY ANNA MARIA BLIGH, the Premier and Minister for Reconstruction of Queensland

AND
ANDREW PETER FRASER, the Treasurer and Minister for State Development and Trade of Queensland

AND NEIL STUART ROBERTS, the Minister for Police, Corrective Services and Emergency Services of Queensland

(in this Deed, each a "Trustee")

BACKGROUND:

- A. The Trust was established under the Trust Deed to provide relief to people who are in distress as a result of the widespread flooding in Queensland in December 2010 and January 2011.
- B. Under the First Deed of Variation the Objects of the Trust Deed were amended to include providing relief to people who are in distress as a result of Tropical Cyclone Yasi.
- C. The Trustees have decided to vary the Trust Deed again to expand the Objects to include the purpose of providing relief (including by way of assistance to re-establish a community) to people who are in distress as a result of the widespread flooding in the Roma district.
- D. In accordance with clause 16.2 of the Trust Deed, the Trustees have given prior notification to the Australian Taxation Office of this variation to the Trust Deed.
- E. In accordance with clause 16.3(a)(i) of the Trust Deed, the amended Objects are substantially similar to the original Objects.

THE TRUSTEES DECLARE AS FOLLOWS:

1. INTERPRETATION

1.1 In this Deed, except where the contrary intention appears:

"Trust Deed" means the Trust Deed for the 2010/2011 Queensland Floods and Cyclone Yasi Disaster Relief Fund dated 19 January 2011 as made by the Trustees and as amended by the First Deed of Variation;

"First Deed of Variation" means the Deed of Variation of the Trust Deed for the 2010/2011 Queens and Floods Disaster Relief Fund dated 6 February 2011; and

"this Deed" means this deed of variation; and

terms capitalised in this Deed and not otherwise defined in this Deed have the meaning given in the Trust Deed.

- 1.2 In this Deed, except where the contrary intention appears:
 - (a) words importing a gender include any other gender;
 - (b) words in the singular include the plural and vice versa;
 - (c) all dollar amounts refer to Australian currency;
 - (d) a reference to any legislation includes any subordinate legislation made under it and any legislation amending, consolidating or replacing it;
 - (e) a reference to an individual or person includes a corporation or other legal entity;
 - (f) the index and clause headings have been included for convenience of reference only and are not intended to affect the meaning or interpretation of this Deed;
 - (g) if an expression is defined, other grammatical forms of that expression have a corresponding meaning, and
 - (h) if the day on or by which any matter or thing to be done under this Deed is a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday in the place where the matter or thing is to be done, the matter or thing may be done on the next Business Day.

2. VARIATION

2.1 As from the date of this Deed the definition of "Disaster" in clause 1.1 of the Trust Deed is deleted and replaced with the following:

"Disaster" means:

- (a) the widespread flooding in Queensland in the areas covered by disaster situations declared under the *Disaster Management Act 2003* (Qld) in December 2010 and January 2011;
- (b) Tropical Cyclone Yasi; and
- (c) the widespread flooding in the Roma district of Queensland covered by the disaster situation declared under the *Disaster Management Act 2003* (Qld) in April 2011;

being disasters that satisfy the requirements of subsection 30-46(1) of the Income Top: Assessment Act 1997 (Cth), namely:

- (d) they were declared to be disasters, or gave rise to declarations of states of emergency, by or with the approval of a Minister of a State or Territory under the law of the State or Territory; and
- (e) they developed rapidly; and
- (f) they resulted in the death, serious injury or other physical suffering of a large number of people, or in widespread damage to property or the natural environment;

- 3.1 If any questions arise as to the construction or meaning of this Deed, the decision of the Trustees on that question will be conclusive and binding.
- 3.2 This Deed is governed by and is to be construed in accordance with the laws of Queensland.



Distribution Committee Proposal



Purpose of the Committee

It is proposed that a Distribution Committee undertakes the coordination of the distribution of the gifts collected by the Premier's Disaster Relief Appeal established to relieve the suffering and distress suffered by the victims of the widespread flooding in Queensland declared or to be declared disaster situations under the *Disaster Management Act* 2003 (Qld).

The distribution of gifts to victims of this disaster will be pursuant to the 2010/2011 Queensland Floods Disaster Relief Fund.

The role of the Committee will be to oversee the distribution of funds.

The Committee will oversee the proper management and administration of the process, and acquittal of all funds expended.

Composition of the Committee and Sub-Committees (if required)

The Committee would be comprised of the following membership:

- The Honourable Dr David Hamill AM (Chairperson);
- The Honourable Robert Schwarten MP, Minister Public Works and Information and Communication Technology and State Member for Rockhampton;
- Mr Vaughan Johnson MP, State Member for Gregory;
- Mr Alan Clayton, State Chairman of the Australian Red Cross, Queensland Branch;
- Cr Paul Bell, Emerald Shire Council and President of the Local Government Association of Queensland;
- Mr Jeff Whalan, Australian Government representative; and
- Mr John Gaskin, Chairman, Queensland Building Services Authority Board (also a member of the Flood Recovery Task Force).

The Committee may be supported by sub-committees, to be established at the discretion of the Committee, in the most affected areas on an as need basis.

The membership of the sub-committees will be determined by the Committee.

The role and function of sub-committees will be determined by the Committee as required

Ail representatives on both the main and any sub-committees are expected to donate their services free of charge with reimbursement for actual costs.

Role of Committee

The role of the Committee is to:

- determine the criteria for distribution of funds including the quantum to each application;
- call for applications for relief funds ensuring wide publicity and ease of lodgment;
- determine the means of assessing applications;
- ensure speedy distribution of funds;
- oversee proper accountabilities of funding disbursement;
- report to the Trustees of the fund on the management and distribution of the fund; and
- other functions as determined by the Trustees (the Premier, Treasurer and Minister for Emergency Services).

Timeliness

The timeliness of distribution of funds is critical to the success of the appeal and to meet public expectations.

Successful applicants will be gifted funds as soon as possible following lodgment of an application.

Acquittal of Funds

The Committee would provide an acquittal of funds to the Trustees of the Fund at the conclusion of the process.

Costs

All administration costs associated with the distribution of the Appeal Fund will be met from the operating budget of the Department of the Premier and Cabinet to ensure that the donated funds are applied for their intended purpose of community recovery.

Meeting of the Distribution Committee

The Committee will meet regularly to determine how best to distribute the funds to assist those affected by the Queensland Floods to recover from this natural disaster.

Reporting to the Trustees

The Committee, will report regularly to the Trustees via the Chairperson of the Committee.

Hi Sue

As requested, below are the points that may be of interest to QAO in considering the proposal:

Background:

It has come to the Distribution Committee's attention that there is a group of up to 750 potential *Structural Damage Assistance – Damaged Home* (Damaged Home) applicants, who are engaged in the internal or external dispute resolution process with their insurer, challenging their ineligible insurance claim decision. A number of these claimants are being assisted by Legal Aid or another community legal group.

The maximum payment amount under the Damaged Home funding round is \$85 000 (a payment of \$5 000 for structural damage and \$10 000 for contents is made up front to all eligible applicants regardless of the status of their insurance claim, with the balance of funds paid at the conclusion of the insurance process).

All eligible insured applicants receive a payment of \$15 000 regardless of the outcome of their insurance claim.

Generally, the payment amount would reduce by the amount of insurance or other assistance (such as the Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements being administered by the Department of Communities). Eg, if an eligible applicant received an insurance payment of \$50 000 then the additional benefit would decrease by this amount. If a payment of \$100 000 was received, then the applicant would not be eligible for any funds additional to the \$15 000 payment base payment.

Legal Aid has indicated that they may advise their clients to abandon their insurance resolution matters in order to be able to be eligible for the full payment (\$85 000) from the appeal up front. However, it is acknowledged that all applicants would not agree to this approach as some would be seeking payment of sums from their insurer far in excess of \$85 000.

The original position of the Distribution Committee was the sufficient appeal funds would be put aside to accommodate these identified claims at the resolution of their insurance resolution process.

It is unknown how long it may take to resolve these insurance resolution matters. However, it is acknowledged that these may be long term matters.

The Proposal:

There is a proposal to make an upfront payment of \$85 000 to all those applicants who identify as being engaged in the internal or external dispute resolution process with their insurer /Financial Ombudsman and to recoup any excess payment identified at the conclusion of the insurance resolution process.

The Mechanism:

Advice has been received that indicates that the proposal can be put into action by Distribution Committee resolution and the execution of a Deed Poll signed by the eligible applicant to provide for the recovery of any excess payments from the applicant as well as strengthening the liaison powers between the Government and the insurer and to include liaison with the Financial Ombudsman in relation to the outcome of external dispute resolution matters.

The Risks:

The ATO has not confirmed its position on this proposal. It is anticipated that formal ATO advice will be received by COB today.

This may be seen to disadvantage other insured applicants who are not involved in the internal / external dispute resolution process, as these applicants must follow due process and receive full payment (if appropriate) at the conclusion of their insurance claim.

Advice on the outcome of the insurance resolution process will need to be obtained from the insurer /Financial Ombudsman in a timely manner.

Should an applicant be successful in having their original insurance decision overturned, they may not agree to return the excess payment from the appeal in which case legal action would be required to pursue the refund.

Some insurers do not provide a cash benefit to successful applicants, but hold funds in trust and case manage repairs to the person's home, in which case there would be no tangible cash pay out to the applicant from the insurer, to be returned to the appeal.

Should the applicant have their original insurance decision overturned and receive payment on their claim, the applicant may still in financial distress and it would be difficult to recoup the excess payment from the appeal.

Excess payments would be returned to the appeal for an unidentified period of time. It is envisaged that these excess funds would be directed to the disaster affected communities to aid their recovery.

Insurance Dispute Resolution - Deed Poll

Issue

- Caxton Legal Centre Inc, the Queensland Law Society and Legal Aid are united in lobbying Government on behalf of their clients who are in dispute with their insurers over denied flood cover. The legal representatives argue that clients locked in dispute resolution are disadvantaged because Government is withholding potential appeal funds from them pending the outcome of the dispute.
- This is not correct, as eligible applicants who declare that their insurer has declined their insurance application are paid their maximum phase two entitlement.

The Proposal

• The legal representatives propose that Structural Damage Assistance—Damaged Home applicants, who are in the Internal or External Dispute Resolution process with their insurers, be immediately paid the maximum payment under the Premier's Disaster Relief Funding Round prior to the resolution of their insurance claim.

Background / Action Taken

- The Chair of the PDRA Distribution Committee wrote to Legal Aid urging them to encourage all of their clients to apply for funds regardless, pointing out that phase one funds may be paid to eligible claimants irrespective of insurance status.
- In addition, the Acting Premier, the Honourable Paul Lucas MP, met with Legal Aid last week to discuss their concerns further.
- Legal Aid and Caxton Legal Centre have previously suggested the number of clients
 adversely affected by insurance dispute processes were in the hundreds and these hundreds
 of clients had not applied to the appeal for fear of being deemed fraudulent should their
 insurance dispute be overturned in their favour.
- As a result of the meeting with Legal Aid, Government provided eight (8) Department of Communities staff to assist Legal Aid in phoning all clients reported to be affected.
- The results of the phone calls by government staff are:

- The majority of clients have either applied, in the process of applying or are ineligible.
- This shows that the majority of applicants who have been denied insurance cover, whether represented by a legal firm or not, have indicated in their appeal application that their

insurer has declined their insurance application. Eligible applicants are then granted their phase two entitlement.

The Department of Communities is aware of two (2) cases only, who have been denied
insurance cover, but have also declared in their application that they will be entering into a
dispute resolution process with their insurer. On this basis, we ask the Distribution
Committee to endorse the attached Deed Poll be provided to all applicants who fit this
category.

Risks

- The ATO has not confirmed in writing its position on this proposal.
- Advice on the outcome of the insurance resolution process from the insurer /Financial Ombudsman may take months or years.
- Legal action would be required to be pursued by Government against the applicant (not the
 insurer) should an applicant be successful in having their original insurance decision
 overturned but not agree to return the excess payment.
- Some insurers do not provide a cash benefit to successful applicants, but hold funds in trust and case manage repairs to the person's home, in which case there would be no tangible cash pay out to the applicant from the insurer, to be returned to the appeal.
- Should the applicant have their original insurance decision overturned and receive payment on their claim, the applicant may still be in financial distress and it would be difficult to recoup the excess payment from the appeal.
- Excess payments would be returned to the appeal for an unidentified period of time. It is envisaged that these excess funds would be directed to the disaster affected communities to aid their recovery.

Recommendation

KEY ISSUES

- RACQ announced on Tuesday 2 August 2011 that they would now accept claims from residents affected by damage from rainfall in the Bremer River catchment.
- At the time of assessment, 150 applicants affected by this decision by RACQ had their insurance claim rejected and received a payment from PDRA.
- It is possible that other insurance companies may make similar announcements in the future.
- In addition, a number of people who have had insurance claims rejected and received payments from PDRA may be in dispute with their insurer. These cases may take months, or even years, to settle.

- Eligible applicants receive a payment of \$40 000 in Round 2 or \$15 000 in Round 3, regardless
 of their insurance status.
- Insurance and ex-gratia payments are then deducted from the maximum Phase 2 amount of \$140 000 in Round 2 and \$75 000 in Round 3 prior to calculation of the final payment. In many cases this means that applicants receive no Phase 2 payment (Attachment 2).
