



KEY ISSUES

- The Queensland Government, through the Queensland Trade and Investment London
 Office, entered into a strategic partnership with CWEIC in March 2017. Queensland is the
 first government entity in Australia to do so.
- As part of the strategic partnership, CWEIC is supporting the development of the program for Trade 2018 to promote the business opportunities available in Queensland and on the Gold Coast, before, during and after the 2018 Gold Coast Commonwealth Games.
- The primary objective of the meeting is to encourage CWEIC and their extensive networks to participate in the Trade 2018 Games Time Trade and Investment program (Trade 2018 program). The current Trade 2018 program is at Attachment 4.
- CWEIC is also seeking sponsorship for three years from the Queensland Government and/or the Gold Coast City Council to fund the expansion of their Commonwealth First network into the Australian market and have provided a proposal to the Queensland Government. This would provide selected small and medium enterprises with training, mentoring and business development support to help them win business in high-growth Commonwealth markets. The expansion proposal is at Attachment 5.




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Overview of aims and objectives of Lord Marland's visit provided by CWEIC

Lord Marland was the founding Chairman of the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council in July 2014. A role that he took up having served as a Minister in the UK Government.

The Queensland Government became a Strategic Partner of CWEIC earlier this year as a result of the Commonwealth Games. The first Government entity in Australia to do so.

Queensland actively participated at the first Commonwealth Trade Ministers Meeting in London in March 2017. The meeting was attended by the Premier as it coincided with the launch of the Commonwealth Games Baton Relay., and Lord Marland had a fruitful bilateral meeting, He has subsequently met the State Treasurer, but as yet not visited Queensland. Lord Marland's visit in December coincides with other engagements in the region, including The Test Match in Melbourne, and visits to Malaysia and Singapore.

As part of the Strategic Partnership CWEIC is committed to support the development of the Trade 2018 programme and Lord Marland will lead a delegation of our CommonwealthFirst Export Champions, and other key stakeholders, to participate in the activities planned at this time. This will be an opportunity for him to meet with key players in the State and those working on the Trade 2018 programme and to understand how best CWEIC can contribute to the success of the programme.

Richard Burge, CWEICs Chief Executive, visited Queensland in September to support the development of Trade 2018 and to initiate conversations about the possibility of establishing a CWEIC office and replicating the CommonwealthFirst programme in Australia. CWEIC has subsequently identified Gold Coast based individuals, including CommonwealthFirst Mentor and former Gold Coast entrepreneur in residence, David Hulston, who they plan to work with to establish CommonwealthFirst Australia.

Establishing CommonwealthFirst Australia (or Queensland) will require seed funding from Government as well as corporate support (the UK programme is funded by Royal Mail)

This year CWEIC has appointed Country Directors in Malaysia and Nigeria and is planning to make additional appointments before next years Heads of Government Meeting.

Lord Marland of Odstock

Lord Marland is Chairman of the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council and Enterprise and Investment Company Ltd. In December 2015, he was awarded the Order of Merit of Malta.

He retired as the Prime Minister's Trade Envoy and Chairman of the Business Ambassador Network at 1 January 2014.

He was Minister for the Department of Energy and Climate Change from 2010 – 2012 and subsequently for the Department for Business, Innovation and Skills.

Lord Marland was one of the founding directors of Jardine Lloyd Thompson plc, a multinational insurance business.

He has founded or led the acquisitions of several companies including:

Janspeed Ltd, Hunter Boot Ltd, Insurance Capital Partners, Jubilee Insurance Ltd, Wisden Cricketer Ltd, Tricouni Brand Ltd, Ecoworld Management and Advisory Services (UK) Ltd and Digital Shopping Channel Ltd.

He is Chairman of Tickets for Troops and the Churchill International Society, President of The Commonwealth Youth Orchestra and Choir, Trustee of Peggy Guggenheim (UK) and The Atlantic Partnership and Patron of Salisbury and South Wiltshire Cricket.

A Commonwealth Games Legacy

The Commonwealth is a market comprising 52 English-speaking countries with a combined population of 2.2 billion – at least 60% under the age of 30 – and a combined GDP in excess of US\$10 trillion.

The Commonwealth Factor, with its shared language, complementary legal systems and business practices, helps make trade on average 19% cheaper between member countries according to recent research by the Commonwealth Secretariat. By 2020 Commonwealth trade is expected to double to US\$1 trillion.

Based on the successful CommonwealthFirst Export Champion program in the U.K. supporting SMEs to trade and invest across the Commonwealth, the CommonwealthFirst Australia program will develop a similar, tailored program for Queensland SMEs.

Aim: To be a conduit fok:

- Queensland growth business seeking export opportunities to trade;
- Growth Companies seeking exposure and investment; and,
- Investment into the State from across the Commonwealth.

This program would build on the strategic partnership agreed between the Queensland Government and CWEIC in March and the Roundtable event in Singapore that proposed the establishment of a CAYE-Asia Pacific Hub in Queensland.

Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council has agreed to appoint David Hulston and Rick Anstey (bio's attached) to lead the establishment of CommonwealthFirst (CWF) in Queensland. They will be responsible for the selection and mentoring of the CommonwealthFirst Export Champions and the introduction of inward investment delegations from the Commonwealth. Through their extensive networks further country and technical experts will be appointed as mentors.

CommonwealthFirst Australia

CWF will select 10-15 **Queensland Export Champions** to be announced as part of **Trade 2018**. These companies would be selected in advance to ensure they have the opportunity to participate in Trade 2018 events and potentially attend the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting and Business Forum in London.

It is envisaged that CWF could operate from a dedicated Commonwealth House in the Gold Coast Health and Knowledge Precinct. Commonwealth House would be a physical location for the development of Commonwealth related legacy projects emanating from the Commonwealth Games.

Over the next three years up to 100 leading SMEs will be selected to become CommonwealthFirst Export Champions. Through intensive training, mentoring, trade missions and business development support, Export Champions will be supported in their quest to win new business in the fast growing Commonwealth markets. Their success will be showcased as an encouragement to the wider business community to make greater use of the Commonwealth network.

The CWF will require sponsorship for 3 years from State Government and/or Gold Coast City Council. The Team will seek Corporate Sponsorship and beyond year 3 it is envisaged that CFF will no longer require funding support from Government as a sponsorship and membership model takes over.

This funding will enable marketing and delivery of the CommonwealthFirst Export Champion program, lead missions to Commonwealth markets and host inward investment missions from other CommonwealthFirst programs.

TIMEFRAME

 To support the meeting with Lord Marland, Chairman of the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council on Wednesday 20 December 2017.

RECOMMENDATION

 Premier seeks Lord Marland's commitment to a Trade 2018 Games Time Trade and Investment program delegation that fully utilises CWEIC's wider Commonwealth networks.

BACKGROUND

- The primary objective for the Queensland Government is to cement the nature, composition and duration of CWEIC's delegation for the *Trade 2018* Games Time Trade and Investment program. An overview of the *Trade 2018* program is at **Attachment 2**. This includes ensuring that CWEIC are actively encouraging delegations from across CWEIC's wider Commonwealth networks.
- CWEIC are seeking to take forward the proposed expansion of their Commonwealth First network into the Australian market and have provided a proposal to the Queensland Government (Attachment 3).
- CWEIC and are also seeking to explore the opportunities for Queensland to support the Commonwealth Business Forum, being held in conjunction with the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) from 16 18 April 2018.

- Trade 2018 culminates with an exciting and innovative Games Time business program that will be hosted at Commonwealth House, a purpose built venue in Broadbeach. Commonwealth House will officially open from 3 April to 15 April 2018, with featured programming to run between 3 and 6 April 2018.
- The Queensland Government, through the Queensland Trade and Investment London Office, entered into a strategic partnership with CWEIC in March 2017. This was prior to the Premier's participation in the inaugural Commonwealth Trade Minister's Meeting and the launch of Trade 2018 in London as part of the activations to mark the launch of the international Queen's Baton Relay (Attachment 5).
- The visit of Lord Marland follows on from the visit of CWEIC's CEO, Richard Burge (in September 2017), facilitated by the Queensland Government.

CURRENT ISSUES

- The Office of the Commonwealth Games are working (in partnership with Trade and Investment Queensland) to agree the CWEIC *Trade 2018* Games Time delegation.
- CWEIC have been advised that any progression of the Commonwealth First proposal is through Trade and Investment Queensland.

CONSIDERATIONS

• CWEIC was established in 2015 to lead the development of a Commonwealth trade agenda, has responsibility for Commonwealth Trade Minister's Meetings and the Commonwealth Business Forum, and delivers the CommonwealthFirst initiative.

- Commonwealth First was established in partnership with the UK Government. CommonwealthFirst
 involves the identification of a cohort of 100 high-growth potential SMEs through a stringent application
 process. Identified SMEs are designated 'Export Champions' and offered facilitation to support their
 future growth;
- The Governor met with Mr David Hulston as part of the *Trade 2018* Singapore international activation.
 Mr Hulston attended the Queensland Investment Roundtable (26 October 2017) and the Queensland and Commonwealth Alliance of Youth Entrepreneurs Asia: Roundtable (27 October 2017).
- Trade 2018 engaged with CWEIC: Malaysia through Mr Tony Collinridge (OBE) as part of its Trade 2018 international activation. OCG continues to work with Mr Collinridge about a Games' Time delegation from CWEIC Malaysia. 

It was a pleasure to meet you in London last month and I am so pleased that the launch of the Queen's Baton Relay was such a success. Thank you for your support for the inaugural Commonwealth Trade Ministers Meeting. We are also delighted that Queensland has become a strategic partner of the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council.

I enclose our interim report on the Trade Ministers Meeting and we look forward to developing a number of the excellent of the excellent proposals that were made at the six roundtable sessions in the run up to the important Heads of Government Meeting in London next year, and the Games. Our priorities will include:

- The appointment of a Commonwealth Trade Ambassador to gauge the trade and investment priorities of member countries and to scope the potential for the development of a "Commonwealth Trade and Investment Accord" which would underpin the development of trade and investment agreements between member countries.
- Identifying opportunities to improve the business environment in member countries and strengthening public-private dialogue. - Exploring the contribution the Commonwealth can make to the deployment of technologies for trade, including the development of paperless trade and collaboration on ecommerce.  will include the expansion of our CommonwealthFirst SME Export programme across member
 countries, as well as continued support for the development of the Commonwealth Alliance of



Regarding Lord Marland's CommonwealthFirst (CWF) Queensland proposal, the concept put forward to the Qld Government included:

- Training and mentoring, including from leading UK exporters, country and technical experts
- Trade missions to Commonwealth markets
- Access to networks and introductions
- Profiling and branding opportunities
- Assistance from the UK Government, Trade Associations, Chambers of Commerce and suppliers
- Access to web-based advice and support

While the proposal is focussed on boosting intra-Commonwealth trade and investment, there would be a level of overlap on trade and investment services already offered by TIQ, which covers not just Commonwealth countries:

- Assessing capability and readiness to export
- Researching and locating market intelligence on industry sector and geo-markets
- Providing advice and assistance around market entry, pricing, logistics, marketing and other aspects of doing business in overseas markets
- Identification of targeted partners, trade opportunities, visits to market
- In-bound, out-bound and virtual trade missions and participation in international trade exhibitions
- Networking opportunities, including with export advisors, market specialist, and potential investors
- Seminars and workshops, providing export training and information on global markets
- TIQ's website also provides information for exporters on the basics of exporting

TIQ is in the process of renewing the Queensland Government's membership with CWEIC, at a cost of 10,000 pounds (approximately A\$17,800). As discussed you may wish to include this in the resposses letter to the CWIEC proposal.

I would suggest something along the following lines (in bold):

"I appreciate your commitment to supporting Queensland businesses seeking to export, and to promoting investment opportunities in Queensland — a commitment that is shared by the Queensland Government through our strategic partnership developed in the lead up to the 2018 Commonwealth Games on the Gold Coast. The Queensland Government is pleased to have renewed this partnership and 2018 membership with CVVIEC.

As background context:

- In early 2017, at the recommendation of former Agent-General, Ken Smith, the Queensland Government signed a one-year agreement to become members of CWEIC (referred to as a strategic partnership). The membership fee was paid by the Office of the Commonwealth Games (OCG), under agreement that future membership would be the responsibility of TIQ.
- As a result of the CWEIC membership, the Premier was invited to attend the Commonwealth Trade Ministers
 meeting in March 2017 and addressed the attendees to promote the Commonwealth Games and Trade 2018, and
 Queensland as a trade and investment partner. This provided significant exposure for Queensland and generated
 a lot of media.
- Through the CWEIC membership, the Premier has also been invited to attend the Commonwealth Business Forum, which takes place in London from 16 to 18 April 2018.
- CWEIC has committed to send a delegation of approximately 20 members to the 2018 Commonwealth Games to
 participate in the Trade 2018 program. TIQ's Europe office and the OCG have worked with CWEIC over the past
 year. The CEO and Chairman of CWEIC have separately visited Queensland (in September and December 2017)
 to discuss opportunities around Trade 2018.
- An invoice for renewal of the Queensland Government's membership was sent to TIQ's Europe office and is now due.
- Renewing membership of CWIEC aims to build on the work undertaken by OCG in the lead up to the Commonwealth Games and provides ongoing access to CWEIC (and Lord Marland's) networks both in UK and other major Commonwealth markets, particularly in markets where TIQ does not have a prescence.

From Office of the Commonwealth Games (in DITID):

- OCG funded the strategic partnership with CWEIC in 2017. The partnership was a 1-year commitment, sunsetting after the CG2018.
- The partnership sets out specific scope of work to support trade and investment outcomes. It also notes that additional activities could be developed under partnership, and which would be costed and agreed on a case by case basis. One activity identified as an example was to partner with the Qld Government to establish a CWF program in Australia.
- OCG not aware of Government committing to a partnership to develop a CWF program in Queensland or that CWEIC will launch a program during Trade 2018.
- Lord M will be attending Trade 2018, hosting a Cth business delegation to Trade 2018 (3-6 April). Lord M will present as a panel member at the Commonwealth Business Advantages and Opportunities session on 4 April. A further CWEIC rep will present as part of the Global Entrepreneur and Investor Exchange session on 5 April.

From TIQ:

- Establishment of an export hub in Queensland as a legacy to GC2018 was something discussed at previous meetings with Lord M, and that Trade 2018 event would be opportunity to test the appetite for a this.
- TIQ was not aware of any commitment being made by Government for the CWF Program, particularly by way financial sponsorship.
- TIQ noted that the CWF program in the UK is funded through corporate sponsorship, and that a CWF Queensland program also envisioned corporate sponsorship.
- TIQ recognise, however, the potential benefit of fostering stronger relationships with CWEIC to leverage their connections.
- TIQ can't confirm outcomes of Lord M's meeting with Premier in Dec 17, as they did not attend.

I've noted the above in TRIM and made a few minor changes to the PBN to reflect. No changes proposed to the reply letter.

I have discussed with Virginia and provide the below comments as input to your brief.

TIQ has reviewed the CommonwealthFirst (CWF) Australia Proposal. From a TIQ perspective, the proposal lacks sufficient detail around the implementation of CWF Australia. Specific aspects for further consideration include:

- how CWEIC CWF would collaborate and work together with TIQ, the Office of Small Business and Advance
 Queensland, existing Queensland Government bodies which already provide a significant range of services to
 Queensland SMEs
- sustainability of the funding model given the reliance on Queensland Government for the first three years, seeking \$1.5 million in funding whereas the CWF model in the UK is based on corporate sponsorship, and was sponsored by Royal Mail and other private organisations.
- The proposed location at the Gold Coast Health and Knowledge Precinct, while a Commonwealth Games legacy, may not be the best location to provide support for Queensland SMEs.
- and assessment of the credentials of agents appointed by CWEIC to establish CWF

TIQ does however recognise there may be benefits in continuing to work with CWEIC to explore opportunities to leverage CWEIC's reach across Commonwealth nations particularly where there is no Queensland Government presence, such as New Zealand, Canada and linking with TIQ's overseas offices in other markets to work as allies.

If DPC wishes to progress this relationship, Trade and Investment Queensland (TIQ) recommends requesting a detailed proposal with itemised costings addressing the above considerations. Further deliberation on the merits and synergies of CVF roust first be determined to ensure this does not overlap with existing services, which should include consultation with TIQ, other Queensland Government agencies listed below and industry bodies, before a decision can be made.

Background

- Early 2017 The Queensland Government signed a one-year agreement to become members of CWEIC, at a cost of 10,000 pounds, which was paid for by the Office of the Commonwealth Games (OCG), under agreement that future membership would be the responsibility of TIQ

- 9-10 March 2017 The Premier was invited by CWEIC to attend the Commonwealth Trade Ministers Meeting and address the attendees, promoting Queensland as a trade and investment partner, Trade 2018 and the Commonwealth Games.
- 14 March 2017 The Premier met with CWEIC and the Commonwealth Secretariat in London when visiting for the launch of the Queen's Baton Relay
- September 2017 Former Queensland Treasurer met with Lord Marland of Odstock, Chairman of CWEIC, during a Queensland Treasury Corporation visit to London.
- September 2017 Richard Burge, CEO of CWEIC, visited Queensland to discuss opportunities around Trade 2018
- December 2017 Lord Marland of Odstock visited Queensland. His visit was facilitated by OCG, CoGC and TIO.
- April 2018 Lord Marland of Odstock is expected to lead a delegation of Commonwealth Export Champions
 to participate in the Trade 2018 program at the Commonwealth Games
- 16-18 April 2018 The Premier has been invited to attend the Commonwealth Business Forum -

I would suggest something along the following lines (in bold):

"I appreciate your commitment to supporting Queensland businesses seeking to export, and to promoting investment opportunities in Queensland — a commitment that is shared by the Queensland Government through our strategic partnership developed in the lead up to the 2018 Commonwealth Games on the Gold Coast. The Queensland Government is pleased to have renewed this partnership and 2018 membership with CVVIEC.

As background context:

- In early 2017, at the recommendation of former Agent-General, Ken Smith, the Queensland Government signed a one-year agreement to become members of CWEIC (referred to as a strategic partnership). I have discussed with Virginia and provide the below comments as input to your brief.

TIQ has reviewed the CommonwealthFirst (CWF) Australia Proposal. From a TIQ perspective, the proposal lacks sufficient detail around the implementation of CWF Australia. Specific aspects for further consideration include:

- how CWEIC CWF would collaborate and work together with TIQ, the Office of Small Business and Advance
 Queensland, existing Queensland Government bodies which already provide a significant range of services to
 Queensland SMEs
- sustainability of the funding model given the reliance on Queensland Government for the first three years, seeking \$1.5 million in funding whereas the CWF model in the UK is based on corporate sponsorship, and was sponsored by Royal Mail and other private organisations.





Purpose:

The Queensland Government has entered into individual partnerships with the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council (CWEIC) and the Commonwealth Secretariat (with the City of Gold Coast) for the delivery of the Trade 2018 program, which includes attraction of delegates to and hosting of events at Commonwealth House (Attachment 1).

This meeting builds on the conversations from the Commonwealth Trade Ministers Meeting (9-10 March 2017) regarding the potential of the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games (GC2018) to support the new Commonwealth trade agenda.

Following the Commonwealth Trade Ministers Meeting, further discussion is required to identify how these partnerships will be operationalised in the lead up to and during the Games.

Additionally, the Commonwealth Secretariat may be interested in becoming a champion of the One Million Stars to End Violence program and this meeting provides an opportunity to discuss potential partnership opportunities.

Trade 2018 Partnerships

• The Queensland Government has entered into a financial partnership with the CWEIC to support Queensland's trade and investment

- interests including the delivery of the Trade 2018 program (Attachment 2).
- The City of the Gold Coast, Queensland Government and Commonwealth Secretariat have also separately agreed to partner on the delivery of the Trade 2018 program (Attachment 3).
- The partnerships are considered beneficial and complementary, but further clarification is required to identify how these partnerships will work together in practice.
- This in-part relates to the fact that the CWEIC is a new organisation and its specific role contrasted with the Commonwealth Secretariat in Commonwealth trade matters is still being defined.
- Discussions led by the Agent-General to date indicate that partnering with the Commonwealth Secretariat and CWEIC could involve:
 - promoting the Commonwealth House program as the Queens Baton Relay completes its international journey
 - collaborating on Games-time events at Commonwealth House related to the new Commonwealth trade agenda
 - supporting participation of influential public and private sector decision-makers in Commonwealth House activities.
- The Premier extended an invitation to Commonwealth Trade Ministers' delegates to a Ministerial-level trade and investment event on the Gold Coast at Games-time.
- If this meeting were to be held on an official basis, it would require the support of the CWEIC and Commonwealth Secretariat (and noting CHOGM is scheduled for the day after the GC2018 closing ceremony).

One Million Stars to End Violence

- As part of the GC2018 arts and cultural program, the Queensland Government through the Office of the Commonwealth Games (OCG) is partnering with Brisbane-based artist, Maryann Talia Pau, who initiated a One Million Stars to End Violence project as a response to her observation of escalating violence in the community.
- The project aims to engage individuals, groups and communities across the world to join a global conversation about ending violence, by encouraging them to weave a star as a symbol of peace and solidarity.
- The project goal is to weave one million stars by 2018.

- It will culminate in a public art installation of one million hand woven stars gathered from across the world, at a location to be determined, for the duration of GC2018.
- The installation will be an inspirational demonstration of the Commonwealth Games Federation's vision of a peaceful, sustainable and prosperous global community and the Queensland Government's commitment to preventing domestic and family violence.
- The project aligns well with the Commonwealth Secretariat's 2017 theme "A Peace-building Commonwealth' and the 'Peace in the home: Ending domestic violence together' initiative which was launched on International Women's Day on 8 March 2017.
- Over 200 official Star Weave Communities have been established across Australia and the world, each pledging to weave 10,000 stars by July 2017. Commonwealth member countries with Star Weave Communities are Australia, Samoa, Canada, Cook Islands, Nigeria, Malaysia, Kenya, Tonga, Fiji, New Zealand and Barbados.
- While there are currently no official Star Weave Communities in the United Kingdom, a number of groups are participating in the project in England including England Bristol Craft Group - Bristol, Highbury Studios - London, Squirrel and Tiffin - Manchester and Team England - London.

Organisation Snapshot:

The Commonwealth

The Commonwealth is a voluntary association of 52 independent and equal sovereign states

The Commonwealth is home to 2.4 billion people and includes both advanced economies and developing countries. Thirty of our members are small states, many of which are island nations.

Our shared values and principles are inscribed in the Commonwealth Charter.

Member countries are supported by a network of more than 80 intergovernmental, civil societies, cultural and professional organisations.



Commonwealth Secretary-General Rt Hon Patricia Scotland (2016 - present)

On 27 November 2015, in Malta, the Commonwealth Heads of Government appointed The Rt Hon Patricia Scotland QC of Dominica as the first woman and the sixth Commonwealth Secretary-General. She assumed office on 1 April, 2016.

Profile

- •Patricia Janet Scotland was born on the 19th August 1955 in Dominica.
- •Moved to the UK with her family, growing up in east London.
- •Trained as a lawyer and became the first black woman to be appointed a Queen's Counsel in 1991. At 35 she was also the youngest woman ever to be made a QC.
- •The first black woman to be appointed Deputy High Court Judge, Recorder and Master of Middle Temple.
- •Joined the House of Lords in 1997 as Baroness Scotland of Asthal going on to serve as a minister in the Foreign Office, Home Office and Lord Chancellor's Department.
- •Undertook major reform of the criminal justice system, including the introduction of the Domestic Violence Crime and Victims Act.
- •Appointed Attorney General in 2007 the first women to hold the post since it was created in 1315.
- •Founded the Eliminate Domestic Violence Global Foundation in 2011.
- •Appointed Prime Ministerial Trade Envoy to South Africa in 2012.
- •Elected as the Alderman of Bishopsgate in the City of London in 2014.

Other offices include Chancellor of the University of Greenwich, Patron of the Corporate Alliance Against Domestic Violence, Patron of Lifeline (Trinidad & Tobago) and the Caribbean Science Foundation.



Lord Marland is Chairman of the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council. He retired as the Prime Minister's Trade Envoy and Chairman of the Business Ambassador Network at 1 January 2014.

He is the former Chairman of the Commonwealth Business Council and was Minister for the Department of Energy and Climate Change in 2010

and subsequently for the Department for Business, Innovation and Skills. Lord Marland was one of the founding directors of Jardine Lloyd Thompson plc, a multinational insurance business and also founded the Jubilee insurance company.

He led the acquisitions of

- 2. Hunter Boot Ltd

- 3. Insurance Capital Partners
- 4. Jubilee Insurance Ltd

Thank you for your email dated 11 October 2016 regarding the opportunity to work with the Commonwealth Secretariat to promote the objectives of a joined-up Commonwealth during the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games (GC2018)

We were delighted to learn of your support for the concept. There are a range of opportunities to realise this, which we believe could be drawn together into a structured "Commonwealth Trade and Investment Program" coinciding with GC2018.

Activities at the proposed "Commonwealth House" would be central to the program, and we are also considering how additional venues might be utilised to broaden the range of official and business functions which could be accommodated.

Separately, the Australian High Commission in London has offered to facilitate an introduction for the Queensland Agent-General in London, Mr Ken Smith, with the Chairman of the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council (CWEIC), Lord Marland. This introduction would be to explore how Commonwealth trade activities planned by the CWEIC could be supported via a trade and investment program coinciding with GC2018.

There may be an opportunity for the Commonwealth Secretariat, CWEIC and Commonwealth Games Federation to come together and directly discuss these opportunities in March 2017. At this time senior representatives from the Queensland Government and the City of Gold Coast are planning to be in London for trade-related meetings around the Queen's Baton Relay at Buckingham Palace on Commonwealth Day.

We recognise significant additional scoping work around this proposal will be required before then. Our representatives have commenced a dialogue with Mr Neil Ford on these matters, and will continue to work through him as a point of coordination, particularly in relation to ensuring alignment with activities of the CWEIC where appropriate.

We look forward to working with you to ensure GC2018 is more than an unforgettable sporting event, but also a vehicle which strengthens economic and cultural ties between Commonwealth member countries.

- The Queensland Government has renewed its membership with CWEIC for 2018, at a cost of £10 000 (AUD\$18 000). Following the Commonwealth Business Forum, TIQ will undertake a review of its long-term position as a CWEIC member.

KEY ISSUES

- CWF Queensland aims to encourage trade and investment across the Commonwealth through small and medium enterprises, and to provide a conduit for Queensland businesses to generate export and investment opportunities.
- A key component of the program will involve the selection of at least 80 Commonwealth Export Champions over three years and across five cohorts. Queensland small and medium size enterprises will be selected based on factors including their high export potential, turnover, revenue growth, employee count and length of operation.
- The proposed CWF Queensland program would deliver legacy outcomes from the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games (GC2018) and *Trade 2018*. It is based on the CWF Export Champion program operating in the United Kingdom and will form part of an ongoing partnership between the Queensland Government and CWEIC.
- It will complement existing Queensland Government commitments to drive trade and investment, including through the investment attraction undertaken by DSDMIP, ongoing TIQ trade and investment services, and initiatives implemented under the Queensland Trade and Investment Strategy 2017 – 2022.
- The total cost of CWF Queensland is estimated to be \$1.65 million, with the Queensland Government contributing up to \$1.5 million over three years (\$500 000 per annum) towards establishment costs, marketing and delivery, trade missions to key Commonwealth markets, and inward investment missions.
- Additional funding is to be sought through sponsorship and cost sharing via business partnerships. This funding will also include the costs of any Queensland Government officer who is seconded to the project.

- It is proposed that funds will be contributed by DSDMIP, TIQ and DPC (drawn from the Director-General's reserve fund), with the arrangement to be overseen by DSDMIP. As part of finalising arrangements, the program and key milestones will be formalised.
- A board will be established to oversee delivery of CWF Queensland with proposed members to include a representative from the Queensland Government, Mr Richard Burge, Chief Executive, Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Courcil, Mr David Hulston, Director, CWEIC Australia, and Mr Rick Anstey, Director, CWEIC Australia.
- Further details about the company structure, primary location, operation and staffing, including matters relating to the ongoing involvement of any seconded Queensland Government officials, are yet to be resolved. - DSDMIP and DPC as necessary will need to undertake further discussions with CWEIC to finalise these arrangements. 1.0 Overview

CommonwealthFirst is a global initiative established by the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council (CWEIC) to encourage and support SMEs to trade and invest confidently across the Commonwealth. By leveraging high-level political buy-in, our corporate and institutional strategic partners and strong support from a wide range of partners including the Royal Family, and building on existing national and state government export support we provide selected "Export Champions" with an opportunity to accelerate their global expansion — with the objective of inspiring other companies to start their export journey.

Over the last three years we have successfully piloted programme in the UK which has delivered strong results and established a strong platform to build on. For example Playdale one of our Export Champions that manufacturers and installs playgrounds has increased exports to the Commonwealth by 492% between 2014 and 2018 (including Queensland). Everledger, a Queensland-UK start-up utilising blockchain technology in the diamond industry, has attracted US\$10 million in Series A funding from Canada and has established operations in India. We have also created greater awareness of Commonwealth markets amongst UK SMEs. The UK pilot will finish at the end of this year.

We are now looking to develop the programme across Commonwealth markets and would like to establish a programme in Queensland as a tangible business legacy of the 2018 Commonwealth Games. There is an enormous opportunity for Queensland to strengthen its trade and investment relationship across Commonwealth markets, but to fully exploit this it is essential that the programme is firmly rooted in Queensland and complements the support already provided to businesses by the Queensland and national Government.

CommonwealthFirst Queensiand will commence with a three year programme to select at least 80 outstanding fast-growing SMEs from across the State to become Commonwealth Export Champions across five cohorts. The Export Champions will be selected on their potential and ambitions to access fast growing developing markets across the Commonwealth, and will act as ambassadors for Queensland both within the international CommonwealthFirst network and globally. They will benefit from mentoring, trade missions and the ability to tap into the international CommonwealthFirst and CWEIC networks to support their international business growth.

As a legacy initiative of the Commonwealth Games, the programme would have the option of being extended for a fourth year to include the Commonwealth Games to be hosted in Birmingham in July 2022. This time period will also include two Commonwealth Heads of Government Meetings (likely Rwanda 2020 and Samoa 2022). Once we have successfully established the model in Queensland we will explore the possibility of expanding the programme across Australia using Queensland as the national hub.

2.0 Partnership

The programme will be a partnership between the Government of Queensland, the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council (CWEIC) and CommonwealthFirst Queensland — which will either be separately incorporated in Australia as a vehicle for programme funding or managed as an autonomous programme either within the Queensland Government or CWEIC. CWEIC will retain ownership and the IP of the CommonwealthFirst brand.

As part of its commitment to delivering the programme the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council will establish its first hub in Australia in Queensland. As well as taking the lead on delivery of the CommonwealthFirst Queensland programme the CWEIC Australia Hub will help develop CWEIC's network of Strategic Partners in Queensland and across Australia, support inward trade and investment delegations into Queensland and develop additional programmes and activity to support trade and investment links between Queensland and the Commonwealth.

The Queensland Government will provide support through a combination of in-kind support and through leveraging existing funding programs to support Queensland exporters. This support will include seconding an official to manage the delivery of the programme and to ensure the programme is fully linked with existing programmes and providing office and meeting space. We will work closely with all State Government agencies including the Premier's Office, Trade and Investment Queensland, Advance Queensland, Business Queensland, Economic Development Queensland and Queensland's diplomatic network (particularly the Agent General in London), as well as national agencies such as Austrade, Regional Development Agencies (RDAs), TradeStart and relevant municipal authorities.

Additional partners and sponsors of the programme will be identified to assist in funding and, equally importantly, mentoring the Export Champions.

Close cooperation with other Queensland based initiatives, such as Life Sciences Queensland and River City Labs, will be a key factor in successful programme delivery. And we will also work closely with international initiatives such as Pitch@Palace which has already been well received in Queensland.

3.0 Governance

A programme board will be established to oversee the delivery of CommonwealthFirst Queensland.

The proposed members would include representatives of Queensland Government, CWEIC and state business representatives. An initial board of seven would be selected including the following "executive" members representing the delivery partners;

Representative of the Government of Queensland (TBC)
Richard Burge, Chief Executive, Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council
David Hulston, Director, CWEIC Australia
Rick Anstey, Director, CWEIC Australia

Other possible "non-executive" members include Leanne Kemp who was part of our first cohort of UK Export Champions and Mario Pennisi who sits on CWEICs Advisory Board as a representative of our strategic partners Life Sciences Queensland – with whom we have an MOU to develop the Commonwealth Innovation Forum which also serve as a legacy of the Commonwealth Games.

Non-executive board members will be unpaid, but reasonable expenses will be paid on a pre-agreed basis. The board will have quarterly calls and will meet once a year to help develop the strategy for the programme and to monitor performance.

The board will be expanded as necessary, possibly with the addition of a non-statutory advisory board, and we are keen to ensure gender balance as well as state-wide representations. Sponsors will also be represented on the board/advisory board as appropriate.

4.0 Activity

We aim to commence delivery of the initial three year programme in August 2018 with the objective of launching in September 2018 as part of the Premier's proposed visit to London and again in November when senior members of the Royal Family will be visiting Queensland. The programme will be initially designed to run until August 2021 — with the possibility of extending the initial programme for a fourth year to include the Birmingham Commonwealth Games in July 2022.

4.1 Website

The programme will be supported by a website and an online platform to facilitate networking between the Export Champions and the wider CommonwealthFirst community

The primary functionality of the website will include:

- Explanation of the CommonwealthFirst Programme
- Profiles of Advisory Board Members and Project Team
- Application process for Commonwealth Export Champions
- Profiles of Participating Companies
- Exporting Knowhow Toolkits
- Access to business services e.g. finance, legal, accounting, mentoring
- Social media links
- Links to relevant external websites including Queensland Government agencies

For the online networking platform we will either use LinkedIn or Graduway – a white labelled platform which we are proposing to trial in the UK.

4.2 Selection of Export Champions

Central to the programme is the selection of at least 80 "Commonwealth Export Champions" over three years. These companies will help provide content and case studies and also become brand ambassadors for both CommonwealthFirst and the wider Queensland business community.

The companies will be selected based on their levels of innovation, ambition and their potential to grow internationally. CommonwealthFirst is looking for outstanding businesses with high export potential and as a guideline the following broad characteristics:

- Turnover between AUS\$250,000 and AUS\$100,000,000
- Employees between 10 and 500.
- Revenue growth greater than 20% per annum
- At least two years of trading

These parameters are only indicative. CommonwealthFirst Queensland will look to recruit a wide range of small and medium sized businesses, from early stage start-ups to businesses that are well established in Queensland but have not fulfilled their export potential.

CommonwealthFirst will identify appropriate companies through a series of regional and sector based roadshows and events, support of partner organisations and also direct approaches to

suitable companies and a rigorous selection process. Each cohort will be focused by sector and region in Queensland and will be targeted for specific trade missions – although all export champions will be invited to participate in the missions.

The first cohort will be selected on a "by invitation" basis to ensure we attract high quality companies – although we will need to ensure this process is fully transparent and companies will still need to complete an online application process which will be open to all. Invited companies will include winners of the Premier's export awards for instance. This will help build momentum for the programme and we anticipate that subsequent selection will then be done through a competitive online and interview selection process to ensure we select companies that are highly committed to the programme.

Each cohort will be announced at a tailored launch event, starting in September 2018, which will be followed by intensive workshops to ascertain export readiness, suitable opportunities and develop an action plan for each company.

4.3 **Mentoring and Training**

The participating companies will have access to a dedicated mentor and team of specialist advisers with skills in relevant areas including market entry, export finance, shipping, law, accountancy etc.

The mentors and advisers will help the Export Champions develop their Commonwealth Export Strategy and identify suitable opportunities for them. The Queensland specific mentors and advisers will be selected during the first phase of the project and will be matched to specific companies. Additional mentors and advisers will be recruited as appropriate. Queensland Export Champions will also be able to draw on the international network of the CommonwealthFirst mentors. 35 mentors have been recruited to date http://www.commonwealthfirst.org/about/mentors/. The mentors and advisers are not paid and expenses are only be paid on a pre-agreed basis. We do not disallow the advisers from establishing a commercial relationship with the Export Champions as long as this is transparent and this is reported to us.

The dedicated mentoring will be complemented by a programme of regular CommonwealthFirst networking and training events. Commonwealth Export Champions will also have access to CWEIC network of Country Directors – currently in Malaysia; Nigeria and Singapore – as well as our 70 strong network of corporate and institutional strategic partners from across the Commonwealth and beyond. A full list of Strategic Partners is attached as **Appendix I**

4.4 Trade Missions and Market Visits

A key part of the experience for the "Commonwealth Export Champions" will be the ability to participate in high level market visits. We will prioritise fast growing emerging markets that are underserved by existing Queensland export programmes and perhaps considered more "complex" than traditional export markets.

Over the course of the programme CommonwealthFirst Queensland will organise high level CommonwealthFirst events and visits to the following Commonwealth markets, as well as to more established markets such as Canada and the UK.

Ghana Kenya India Malaysia Nigeria South Africa Singapore Sri Lanka

The first Trade Mission is proposed for Malaysia and Singapore in early December 2018 to explore opportunities across the ASEAN region.

There will be a strong focus on opportunities with Africa with proposed trade missions to East, Southern and West Africa. Subsequent missions will focus on the opportunities in South Asia, SAARC, The Pacific.

There will be a minimum of six official trade missions across the three years – with a possible extension to include a trade mission to participate in the trade programme organised as part of the Commonwealth Games in Birmingham in 2022.

Export Champions will participate at their own expense and where appropriate pay a small administrative fee to ensure commitment to the programme. CWEIC and its partners will aim to minimise costs through partnerships with relevant service providers (airlines, hotels etc).

Sector specific visits and overseas trips for individual companies meeting specific customers will be arranged as appropriate. And there will also be opportunities to participate in high profile events organised by CWEIC and our partners such as the Commonwealth Business Forum and the Commonwealth Trade Ministers Meetings, as well as to participate in other Trade Missions and activities organised by the Queensland Government.

5.0 Monitoring and Evaluation

Tracking the outcomes of the programme and the progress of the Export Champions will be crucial to the success of the programme.

CommonwealthFirst aims to help Export Champions increase exports by 30% year on year after completion of the programme.

An independent evaluation of the programme will be undertaken annually with a comprehensive independent review at the end of the initial three/four year. This will underpin any decision to extend the programme further.

6.0 Budget

The total cost of the initial three year programme is estimated to be AUS\$1.65 million – with the option of extending to a fourth year. Please see indicative budget attached as **Appendix II.**

The Queensland Government would make a total annual contribution of up to AUS\$500,000 annually in in-kind support and financial support by leveraging existing export programme — the total contribution for the initial three year programme would be equivalent to AUS\$1.5million.

Additional revenue will be sought through sponsorship and cost-sharing (i.e. partnerships with airlines, hotels etc) which will be re-invested in developing the programme. A separate sponsorship plan will be developed.

Our ambition is to make the programme self-financing by the end of the initial three/four years.

A Commonwealth Games Legacy

The Commonwealth is a market comprising 52 English-speaking countries with a combined population of 2.4 billion – at least 60% under the age of 30 – and a combined GDP in excess of US\$10 trillion.

The Commonwealth Factor, with its shared language, complementary legal systems and business practices, helps make trade on average 19% cheaper between member countries according to recent research by the Commonwealth Secretariat. By 2020 Commonwealth trade is expected to double to US\$1 trillion.

The Commonwealth includes some of Queensland's most important trade and investment partners, including the United Kingdom, India, New Zealand, Singapore, Papua New Guinea, Malaysia and Canada. Combined these markets are worth more than \$9.4 billion in export value to Australia.

Based on the successful CommonwealthFirst Export Champion program in the U.K. supporting SMEs to trade and invest across the Commonwealth, the CommonwealthFirst Australia program will develop a similar, tailored program for Queensland SMEs.

This program would build on the strategic partnership agreed between the Queensland Government and CWEIC in March 2017 and the Roundtable event in Singapore, in October 2017, that proposed the establishment of a CAYE-Asia Pacific Hub in Queensland.

Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council has agreed to appoint David Hulston and Rick Anstey (bio's attached) to lead the establishment of CommonwealthFirst (CWF) in Queensland. They will be responsible for the selection and mentoring of the CommonwealthFirst Export Champions and the introduction of inward investment delegations from the Commonwealth. Through their extensive networks further country and technical experts will be appointed as mentors in addition to the global network of mentors already in place.

The three main aims of CommonwealthFirst Australia can be summarized as, to be a conduit for:

- Queensland growth business seeking export opportunities to trade;
- Growth Companies seeking exposure and investment; and,
- Investment into the State from across the Commonwealth.

In order to achieve maximum impact at Commonwealth Games time and throughout Trade 2018 events, the CommonwealthFirst program needs to be launched as early as possible in the New Year.

In an initial phase CWF will select 10-15 **Queensland Export Champions** to be announced as part of **Trade 2018**. These companies would be selected in advance to ensure they have the opportunity to participate in Trade 2018 events and potentially attend the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting and Business Forum in London.

Over the next three years up to 100 leading SMEs will be selected to become CommonwealthFirst Export Champions. Through intensive training, mentoring, trade missions and business development support, Export Champions will be supported in their quest to win new business in the fast growing Commonwealth markets. Their success will be showcased as an encouragement to the wider business community to make greater use of the Commonwealth network.

It is envisaged that CWF could operate from a dedicated Commonwealth House in the Gold Coast Health and Knowledge Precinct. Commonwealth House would be a physical location for the development of Commonwealth related legacy projects emanating from the Commonwealth Games.

The CWF will require sponsorship for 3 years from State Government and/or Gold Coast City Council. The Team will seek Corporate Sponsorship and beyond year 3 it is envisaged that CWF will no longer require funding support from Government as a sponsorship and membership model takes over.

The funding requirement is for Government support of \$500,000 per year for the each of the first 3 years. This funding will cover establishment costs, enable marketing and delivery of the CommonwealthFirst Export Champion program, trade missions to Commonwealth markets and host inward investment missions from other CommonwealthFirst programs. Corporate sponsorship will help subsidise trade and investment mission costs.

Following Lord Marland's visit in December 2017, the CommonwealthFirst team is ready to activate the program detailed above in line with Trade 2018 objectives. This program will form a realization of the Government's aim to maximize the long-term international business legacy of GC2018.

What does being an Export Champion mean and what are the benefits?

The current UK program offers successful applicants the opportunity to be part of an intensive 3-year programme with international support including:

- Trade missions: to fast growing Commonwealth markets
- Access to high level networks and introductions: to ensure you are dealing with the right people in country
- Training and mentoring: support from leading UK exporters, country and technical experts
- Unrivalled profiling and branding opportunities
- Assistance from UK Government, Trade Associations, Chambers of Commerce and a network of Suppliers
- Wider web platform providing advice and support to SMEs looking to expand into Commonwealth markets

The CommonwealthFirst Program will select the initial cohort of export champions and seek to offer similar benefits. The program team will work with organisations like TIQ and Export Council of Australia and other CWEIC country managers. A strict application process will select further cohorts.

"In July 2016, CWEIC announced its first cohort of UK SMEs where Everledger was selected to become a CommonwealthFirst Export Champion. Since this time, Everledger has advanced strategically and have systematically scaled from its local UK origins to a number of Commonwealth markets. Within 12 months of the program, revenues have exceeded \$1Mil in direct client billing within the Commonwealth region alongside a resource growth of 30 in the team and with supporting clients in Canada, India, Singapore, UK and Australia."

What benefit is there to being part of a network of Export Champions from across the Commonwealth?

As the CommonwealthFirst Export Champion program expands across the Commonwealth, past and present members will gain a status as leading exporters, trusted and respected by their partners and peers. The status of Export Champion means a company has been vetted and is supported by CWEIC. These companies will empitomise the best of what Commonwealth trade represents and provide inspiration to other businesses that aspire to do the same.

What does success of the CommonwealthFirst program look like and how will it be measured?

CommonwealthFirst Export Champions will be assisted to enter new markets and increase their exports. CommonwealthFirst aims to help Export Champions increase exports by 30% per year after they have participated in the 3-year program.

Over the three-year period 100 Export Champions will be selected and each will be individually assisted to enter and expand in new Commonwealth markets. The most recent CommonwealthFirst UK Export Champion delegation to Canada resulted in 10 companies doing business in Canada for the first time.

CWEIC and the CommonwealthFirst Australia team will also introduce, and coordinate with local organisations, inward investment opportunities. This will include delegations from the Commonwealth for Trade 2018 activities.

What is the wider objective of CommonwealthFirst?

The Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council's objective is to establish CommonwealthFirst Export Champions programs across the most significant and strategic Commonwealth market areas. The Australian program will be the second, following on from the successful UK program.

CWEIC has recently appointed representatives in Singapore, Malaysia and Nigeria. Further appointments will be ongoing throughout 2018. These representatives will be available to assist Export Champions enter those markets.

The CommonwealthFirst Export Champions will join an exclusive Commonwealth wide cohort of leading exporters.

CommonwealthFirst Australia, as the first non-UK program, has the opportunity to develop the template for building a local organization. As such, it will gain significant recognition across the Commonwealth and publicity at events such as the Commonwealth Business Forum.

After the initial three-year period of Government support it is envisaged that membership and corporate sponsorship will be sufficient to fund the operation of the CommonwealthFirst Export Champion program.

KEY ISSUES

You are attending a dinner with Lord Marland of Odstock (Jonathan), Chairman, Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council (CWEIC).

- The purpose is to:
 - reaffirm the Queensland Government's support for the CWEIC as strategic partners
 - discuss opportunities to use this relationship to promote future trade and investment.
- From this meeting the Queensland Government is seeking trade and investment opportunities for Queensland's priority sectors. Relevant sectors include health, education, advanced manufacturing, tourism, mining services and energy for new and existing markets within the Commonwealth such as India and African nations.
- The CWEIC is likely to use this opportunity to inform you of their expansion plans across the Commonwealth via increased Strategic the establishment of regional Partnerships, implementation of regional CommonwealthFirst export programs.
- The Queensland Government renewed its strategic partnership with CWEIC for 2019 at a cost of £10,000 (approximately A\$18,000). The Queensland Government has been a CWEIC strategic partner since January 2017.
- A Strategic Partner is the term given to CWEIC membership. It provides direct access to CWEIC's international hubs including Malaysia Nigeria, Singapore and India. Membership provides connectivity with other Strategic partners (both corporate and government) and enables access to CWEIC missions and events including the Commonwealth Business Forum and Trade Ministers Meeting.
- The Queensland Government recently declined an offer from CWEIC to support a CommonwealthFirst Queensland proposal which sought funding of \$1.5 million over three years.

- In January 2019, Lord Marland met with the, Australian High Commissioner, the Honourable George Brandis and the Agent-General to discuss the Federal Government's support for CommonwealthFirst as part of the Commonwealth Games Legacy.

 to participate in the CWEIC Commonwealth Trade Mission to Riyadh,
 Saudi Arabia. The Trade and Investment Commissioner for the

- You met with Lord Marland on 20 December 2017 during his visit to Brisbane in preparation for the CWEIC Business Mission to the Gold Coast Commonwealth Games.

• RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that you:

- note the CommonwealthFirst (CWF) Queensland proposes funding of services already provided by Trade and Investment Queensland (TIQ), at a greater cost and with an under-developed delivery model
- note that there are opportunities to partner with the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council (CWEIC) in relation to hosting a summit in India, an initiative under the Queensland-India Trade and Investment Strategy
- approve and sign the reply letter to Lord Marland of Odstock (Attachment 1), seeking further discussions around holding a Queensland - India Summit in India.

KEY ISSUES

- This is the third CWF proposal CWEIC has provided to the Queensland Government since January 2018. As per the two previous proposals, many of the services proposed are already provided by TIQ, both in India and Queensland, and by other departments or agencies.
- India is the focus of this third proposal, however the proposal does not address how services provided under the CWF program provide additional value to those already being funded by the Queensland Government, through the Queensland–India Trade and Investment Strategy.
- The proposal is to support 30 businesses per year, totalling 90 businesses across three years at a cost of \$572,952, however there is limited detail on the delivery model.
- India is one of seven TIQ flagship priorities for 2019–20 and TIQ will focus its efforts in India on mining equipment, technology and services (METS) and education. India is a challenging market and the appetite of Queensland companies to engage with the market requires considerable effort, with METS and education likely to produce the best results in the short term
- CWEIC's capability to support Queensland businesses in India is not effectively addressed in the proposal. CWEIC has recently signed an agreement with the Government of Gujarat to deliver a CVF network, however this is yet to be established. CWEIC is also working to establish networks in seven other Indian States.
- CWEIC's current strategic partners in India, Federation of Indian Chambers and Industry and Confederation of Indian Industry are also longstanding TIQ partners.
- IIQ renewed the Queensland Government's membership as a 2019 CWEIC Strategic Partner at a cost of 10,000 pounds (approximately A\$18,000) in February 2019. The renewal of the partnership enables access to the srategic partner network, participation in CWEIC business missions and speaking opportunities at CWEIC's high profile events such as the Commonwealth Business Forum.
- TIQ recommends maximising the existing strategic partnership to connect Queensland businesses with the CWF network as it develops in India, while exploring opportunities for future cooperation.
- Pending further discussion with CWEIC, possible areas for cooperation in India may include:

- partnering with CWEIC on promotion and delivery of an India Summit
- connecting Queensland businesses with the CWF network in India.
- In TIQ's proposed Ministerial Mission Program, the Honourable Kate Jones MP, Minister for Innovation and Tourism Industry Development and Minister for the Commonwealth Games, is recommended to visit India in November 2019, which could coincide with the delivery of the Summit.

BACKGROUND

- The Chairman of CWEIC, Lord Marland of Odstock, wrote to you on 1 May 2019 with a proposal for a CommonwealthFirst: Queensland program (Attachment 2).
- CWEIC is aligned to the Commonwealth Heads of Government to promote intra-Commonwealth trade and investment and the role of the private sector across the 52 member countries. It is responsible for the Commonwealth Business Forum alongside the biennial meetings of the Commonwealth Heads of Government and Commonwealth Trade Ministers.
- CWEIC strategic membership provides a platform to promote Queensland and encourage UK businesses to look at opportunities in Queensland. CWEIC contacts are a useful channel for the promotion of Queensland capability in the lead-up to other major events such as the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games.
- CWEIC has identified India as a key export and investment market for its strategic partners. Mr Gitesh Agarwal, Queensland Trade and Investment Commissioner - India recently participated in the CWEIC business mission to India, and a second mission to India is being planned.
- As a CWEIC Strategic Partner, TIQ has gained access to key influencers across the Commonwealth which would otherwise have been difficult to access. CWEIC also has strong links to African markets and the Asia-Pacific Commonwealth markets which, in the future, TIQ will be able to leverage if it continues its strategic partnership.

1.0: CommonwealthFirst

CommonwealthFirst (CWF) is a programme established by the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council (CWEIC) to grow Intra-Commonwealth trade by supporting Small and Medium Enterprises to export confidently to new Commonwealth markets.

CWF has two primary objectives, to support:

- Governments and their commercial partners in increasing their volume of Commonwealth exports and;
- SME's to expand their operations and grow into new Commonwealth markets.
 Opportunities include facilitated trade missions and also 1-2-1 technical support and mentoring.

2.0: The Proposition Details

- CWF can be built to the participant numbers required by the Market Sponsor;
- The CWF Queensland program is proposed to constitute 30 businesses a year, for 3 years (90 businesses) overall at a total 3-year cost of \$572,952 or £314,820
 - A full budget breakdown is available as required.

Further details of the proposition, the ambition, provities and outcomes are outlined in paragraphs 10 – 12.

3.0 The Commonwealth Enterprise and investment Council

CWEIC is the Commonwealth's business organisation chaired by Lord Marland, who served as Prime Minister David Cameron's Trade Envoy. CWEIC has a mandate from Commonwealth Heads of Government to promote trade, investment and the role of the private sector. CWEIC's Chief Executive is Mr Alan Gemmell (OBE), who joined CWEIC in December 2018 from his role as Director of the British Council in India. Mr Gemmell brings to CWEIC his vast experience and connections across the Indian business and government communities.

CWEIC has close to 80 Strategic Partners from over 20 Commonwealth countries; including both Australia and India. By 2021 CWEIC will have grown this business network to 180 Strategic Partners; providing access, insight and influence across the Commonwealth with a focus on business-to-Government engagement.

CWEIC currently has established international operations in 6 priority Commonwealth markets; including the UK (including a particular focus on the City of London), Malaysia, Singapore, Nigeria, Malta and Sri Lanka. CWEIC has also recently signed a MoU with the Government of Gujarat and is currently working to further develop its presence across India and to further develop its international operations across Australia and the Pacific, the Caribbean (through a recent partnership established with the Government of the Cayman Islands) and East Africa, as CWEIC looks forward to delivering the Commonwealth Business Forum in Rwanda, in 2020.

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4: CWEIC and India:

With a population of over 2.4 billion and a combined GDP that is projected to continue to grow to UKS \$13 trillion by 2020, the Commonwealth maintains a global relevance to trade. The Commonwealth represents over one-third of the world's population and will contain over 40% of the global workforce in the next two years. Of the Commonwealth's 2.4 billion people over 60% are under 30, with a burgeoning middle class consumer base that will reach one billion over the next 2 years. Significantly, India's path of growth is set to see India become the world's largest economy behind China by 2050, with an economy 60 times that of Queensland's.

Recognising the importance of fostering relationships and collaboration in the Indian market CWEIC continues to develop a strong Strategic Partner network across India. CWEIC has prioritised both Government and Institutional partners with whom CWEIC is already developing collaborative programming. For example CWEIC signed a MoU to deliver a CommonwealthFirst network with the Government of Gujarat. Two of CWEIC's Strategic Partners exemplify the strength of this network and include:

Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI):

- Established in 1927, FICCI is the largest and oldest apex business organisation in India. FICCI is the voice of India's business and industry. From influencing policy to encouraging debate, engaging with policy makers and civil society, FICCI articulates the views and concerns of industry. It serves its members from the Indian private and public corporate sectors and multinational companies, drawing its strength from diverse regional chambers of commerce and industry across states, reaching out to over 2,50,000 companies. FICCI provides a platform for networking and consensus building within and across sectors and is the first port of call for Indian industry, policy makers and the international business community and;
- CWEIC is currently working with FICCI as an in-market partner for taking forward CWF proposals and market connections across a series of Indian states including those Indian states of priority to Queensland including; Gujarat, West Bengal, Telangana, Karnataka and Banglaru.

Confederation of Indian Industry (CII):

- The Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) works to create and sustain an environment conductive to the development of India, partnering industry, Government, and civil society, through advisory and consultative processes. Founded in 1895, CII has around 9000 members, from the private as well as public sectors, including SMEs and MNCs, and an indirect membership of over 300,000 enterprises from around 276 national and regional sectoral industry bodies.
- CH charts change by working closely with Government on policy issues, interfacing with thought leaders, and enhancing efficiency, competitiveness and business opportunities for industry through a range of specialized services and strategic global linkages. It also provides a platform for consensus-building and networking on key issues and;
- With 65 offices, including 9 Centres of Excellence, in India, and 10 overseas offices in Australia, China, Egypt, France, Germany, Singapore, South Africa, UAE, UK, and USA, as well as institutional partnerships with 355 counterpart organizations in 126 countries, CII serves as a reference point for Indian industry and the international

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business community. CWEIC is currently working CII to develop CWF proposals for Indian States that includes Maharashtra and Delhi.

5: CWEIC's Recent Successes in India

CWEIC further developed its profile and relationships in India with an extremely successful trade mission to 'Vibrant Gujarat'. Due to the size and scale of CWEIC's delegation (of over 75 senior business and Government leaders), was CWEIC recognised as an official event partner. 'Vibrant Gujarat' saw CWEIC successfully establish a Memorandum of Understanding with the Government of Gujarat to progress a Strategic Partnership and a CWEIC: CommonwealthFirst Program. Following 'Vibrant Gujarat' CWEIC is currently working to develop matching proposals for seven other priority Indian states. Of particular interest to the Queensland Government will be CWEIC's partnership proposals with the Indian State Government's of West Bengal, Bengaluru, Karnataka, Maharashtra and Telangana; all states identified by the Queensland Government as representing priority opportunities. CWEIC's progress in India, alongside the development of its operations and Strategic Partner base across the wider-Africa has ensured that CWEIC has unique government and business connections across two of the world's largest and fasted growing economies.

6.0 CWEIC and Queensland: A Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games Legacy

The CWEIC and Queensland Government is a relationship cemented through GC2018 and one that continues to offer value to-date; for example:

- Providing Queensland Government with internationally high-profile opportunities; for example speaking opportunities at the 2017 Commonwealth Trade Ministers Meeting and 2018 Commonwealth Business Forum;
- Supporting Queensland Government in developing emerging industries; for example providing speakers and delegates to the LifeScience Queensland led Commonwealth Innovation Forum and committing to grow this forum to an established Commonwealth platform;
- Helping to connect Queensland to the Commonwealth and vice-versa. For example CWEIC brought the single-largest international delegation to support the *Trade 2018* program;
- Providing Trade and investment Queensland with valuable connections across CWEIC's Strategic Partner network (for example Arup) and Queensland companies with opportunities; for example in attending CWEIC's recent Rwanda Mining Event and;
- Work is also underway with the Office of Queensland's Chief Entreprenuer (in coordination with TIQ Europe and London) to deliver a Commonwealth and Queensland Technology event. This will be timed with the London Tech Week (June 2019) and support Queensland's (and the wider Australia) delegation to LTW.

7: CommonwealthFirst: An Overview

CWF provides a structured approach to maximising the unique trading opportunities presented by the Commonwealth, in-particular the:

 Size and demography of the Commonwealth: With the 53 nations of the Commonwealth representing over one-third of the World's population and the trading

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opportunities presented by the Commonwealth's exponentially increasing middleclass. The scale and potential of the Commonwealth is well represented by India, which by 2050 is expected to have a population that will be almost 60 times of Queensland's. This has seen Commonwealth trade continue to grow at a time of increasing world uncertainty and;

 The Commonwealth Business Advantage: Where the consistency of language, legal systems and financial systems across the Commonwealth has been shown to present a 19% trading advantage for Intra-Commonwealth trade.

8: CommonwealthFirst: The Story-to-date and the Next Steps: 2019-21

Leanne Kemp: CEO Everledger (CWF Export Champion) and Queensland's Chief Entrepreneur

The CWF Program was launched at the CWEIC led 2015 Commonwealth Business Forum (CBF), in Malta. CWF was piloted through four cohorts of SME's totalling 100 business across 2016 – 2018; with key highlights including the:

- Recruitment of 100 business across the pilot. Whilst the pilot was trialled with the UK market in-mind, its participants were international in nature;
- Delivery of 17 CWF export focused events including a Commonwealth Export Day and a Commonwealth First International Festival of Business;
- Delivery of 2 targeted Trade Missions per year for CWF participants to 6 priority Commonwealth markets including: Canada, Malaysia, Singapore, India and Australia. The CWF program continues in 2019 with a return to the Indian market through CWEIC's role as a Partner Organisation to the 'Vibrant Gujarat' Global Summit in January 2019;
- Recruitment and appointment of a high level and international business mentor network (currently comprising over 40 international business leaders) to provide expertise and insight on an unique 1-2-1 basis for program participants and;
- There were also business specific outcomes for cohort members; for example:
 - Playdale increased exports to the Commonwealth by 492% and;
 - Everledger a Queensland based enterprise who joined the UK cohort to leverage the opportunities presented by CWF. These included participating in a number of the CWF trade missions; including those to India, where Everledger used the connections generated by CWEIC to establish operations; Canada where Series A funding of over £10mUS was attracted and to Queensland; where the founder, Leanne Kemp was a keynote speaker to Trade 2018 and the Commonwealth Innovation Forum.

9: CommonwealthFirst 19-21:

Building on the successful pilot CWEIC has two linked priorities for CWF across 19-21:

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- Expand the CWF network to create a trusted community of credible SME's that stretches across the Commonwealth. The aspiration is to build the CWF business network to over 400 business by the time of the 2020 CBF; with a CWF presence for all priority Commonwealth markets. CWEIC is actively developing CWF networks in the UK, Malta, Australia, Malaysia, Nigeria and India, and;
- Ensure that the CWF international networks are expanded in a co-ordinated way with a real synergy of opportunity across the network; for example CWF networks are being developed around:
 - Shared Commonwealth priority sectors for example innovation, with these sectors having been identified to reflect both priorities across the Commonwealth and also to enhance existing Queensland Government strategies and programmes. For example Advance Queensland and Advancing Trade and Investment: Queensland's Trade and Investment Strategy, and Queensland – India Trade and Investment Strategy (ITIS): 2018 – 2023, and;
 - Broader themes to help countries meet the Commonwealth's Sustainable
 Development Goals; for example around Gender Equality (SDG 5) and Economic Growth (SDG 8)

10: Commonwealth First: Queensland: The India Market Opportunity

Following a discussion between The Honourable Annastacia Palaszczuk, MP, Premier of Queensland and CWEIC, CWF Queensland is designed with a focus on the Indian market. CWF Queensland is designed to support the Government of Queensland's objective of maintaining its position within Australia as having the largest share of exports to India, enhancing market understanding and increasing investment from India:

As outlined in Paragraph 12 CWF will deliver a series of structured activities that will directly support two of the priority targets within Queensland's ITIS:

Increasing the number of opportunities facilitated by Queensland Government by 50% over the next 5 years and;

Increasing the total exports from Queensland to India by 50% over the next 5 years.

CWF Queensland is designed to directly support Queensland Governments' ITIS Key Initiatives, specifically:

- Elevate Queensland's Profile in India through CWF Queensland by:
 - Strengthening Queensland's reputation across priority sectors and support the Commonwealth's Government 'Brand Australia' Programme. CWF cohorts will be recruited against sectors of mutual priority between Queensland and India identified through the ITIS. It is proposed that CWF Queensland will target innovation across the following sectors: Education and Ed Tech, Training, METs (and Renewable Energy), Food & Ag and Healthcare;
 - Providing a focal point for Queensland businesses to increase their understanding of key in-market events and forums, and;
 - Targeting CWF: Queensland Trade Missions to increase Queensland's presence at major Indian conferences to India. CWEIC will build from a position of strength as an Official Partner to Vibrant Gujarat 2019 and ensure that CWF Trade Missions are timed to coincide with major in-market trade events. With timings and opportunities guided by CWEIC's network of Strategic Partners and State Government partners;

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- Build the Capability of Queensland's business community to successfully operate in India by:
 - Putting in place a structured approach to maximise the opportunities presented by CWEIC's Strategic Partner network to Queensland, with a particular priority of supporting TIQ: India's in-market presence. In particular CWEIC will ensure that TIQ is introduced to CII and FICCI and that opportunities are provided to brief/ debrief CWF participants, pre and post Trade Missions;
 - Utilising CWEIC's Strategic Partner network to support TIQ in facilitating
 Queensland businesses 'landing' in India. For example CWEIC is currently working
 with FICCI to explore the opportunity for shared meeting space for CWF
 participants; an opportunity that would be extended to CWF Queensland
 participants;
 - CWEIC has established a strong social media presence following its successful Vibrant Gujarat mission. CWF success stories and Trade Missions will be proactively communicated across CWEIC's; media channels, priority events and strategic partner network and;
 - O CWEIC proposes to work with the Government of Queensland to scope a Queensland in India event that could form part of the programming for the 2020 Commonwealth Business Forum. This could provide a great opportunity to add prestige, international awareness and momentum to Queensland's ITIS commitment to developing an annual Queensland India trade event. The participation of CWF Queensland members would demonstrate Queensland's growth and credibility across the Indian market to a global audience of senior business and government leaders.
- Develop Queensland's Market intelligence and understanding of the opportunities presented across the Indian market by:
 - CWEIC leveraging its Strategic Partner network to provide market access and sector insight sessions across the priority Indian states identified in para 4 for CWF Queensland participants (alongside additional Commonwealth country market and sector webinars as part of the wider participant package). This will see CWF participants receive a minimum of 1 targeted market and/ or sector webinar being delivered per month. CWF Queensland participants will be able to continue to access CWF webinars post-program completion. CWEIC will prioritise digital channel delivery to provide a more efficient delivery system and the collation of more effective customer intelligence and;
 - o CWEIC will work with both Queensland Government and its wider Strategic Partner network to support Queensland in its priority of developing market intelligence reports. In particular to maximise the wealth of material and insight already produced by partners such as FICCI and CII, plus CWEIC's Government partners.
- Foster long term relationships and collaboration across Queensland and India by:
- Prioritising the development of a long term relationship between the Queensland Government, CWF Queensland Participants and CWEIC's Strategic Partners who prioritise the Indian market. A particular priority will be placed on early engagement with CWEIC's Institutional Strategic Partners from India, CII and FICCI. Specific opportunities will be sought to provide opportunities for businesses to meet, connect and network;

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- Providing CWF participants with the ability to directly connect with wider CWF networks through CWEIC's app that will be rolled out to SP's and CWF participants from August 2019. This app will enable participants to directly communicate and to build a long lasting alumni network for CWF participants so they can build long term connections and networks;
- CWEIC prioritising Queensland as a market of opportunity within the GWF india State Government proposals and in particular identify Queensland as a priority location for their trade missions. This will help bring targeted delegations of Indian businesses to Queensland to support the Queensland Government in establishing contact with Indian businesses who have an interest in Australia with a view to establishing an office in Queensland. A provisional target could see CWEIC bringing 25 Indian businesses per year to visit Queensland as part of reciprocal CWF trade missions. Where possible/ desirable this would be timed with major Queensland events; for example Qode/;
- Each member of the CWF Queensland will receive a coach targeted to the requirements of the business. For those businesses prioritising the Indian market, CWEIC will seek to provide a coach with the requisite market expertise to support those Queensland businesses seeking to grow their operations into India. The international nature of CWEIC's mentor network will also enable CWF India participants to be able to better understand and embrace reciprocal opportunities within Queensland. This will also provide an opportunity to collaborate and add value to TIQ's work in establishing the proposed Queensland India mentor network as per the ITIS,
- Supporting Queensland in setting up partnerships and MoU's with priority Indian states and:
- CWF Queensland will provide a structured approach that will directly assist
 Queensland's aspiration of developing a program that will support collaboration to
 develop collaboration across priority industries between Queensland and India.

11: The Proposition Details

- CWF can be built to the participant numbers required by the Market Sponsor;
- CWF Queensland is proposed to consist of:
 - o 1 cohort of 30 participants per year;
 - 90 participants across the 3 years at a total cost of AD \$6,366 or £3,498 per participant \$572,952 or £314,820 and;
 - A full budget breakdown is available as required.

CWF Queensland will:

- Deliver from Day 1; with the announcement confirming cohort 1 participants;
- Identify participants from across Queensland through regional and sector based roadshows;
- Ensure its selection process is both competitive and transparent; to ensure that only high quality participants, who will be actively engaged with the scheme are selected and;
- Support and add value to Queensland Government Agencies, Programmes & Strategies including, Advance Queensland and Advancing Trade and Investment: Queensland's Trade and Investment Strategy

13: CommonwealthFirst Queensland: The Sponsor's Value Proposition

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- Recognition and high-profile opportunities for the Sponsor through:
 - A programme directly designed to support Queensland's strategic priorities with a particular focus on the Indian market;
 - Key note speaking and associated sponsor activities across CWEIC's high profile and impact events e.g. CBF/ Commonwealth Innovation Forum;
 - Recognition as CWF Queensland Sponsor and branding across CWF Queensland material, activities & events, and;
 - High level networking opportunities including Heads of Government, Ministers and C-suite business level,

14: CommonwealthFirst Queensland: The Participant Value Proposition

CWF Queensland participants will receive the following commitments:

- a briefing conversation with CWEIC within two weeks of joining the programme to ensure that CWEIC are clear as to the participants priorities and requirements in joining the program
- access to a dedicated network of senior and impactful contacts who will provide:
 - Insight to support participants in accessing and entering new markets, with India being a clear priority;
 - Influence to support participants in being able to rapidly expand an in-market presence;
 - Insight to support a participant grow their business idea;
 - Insight to support a participant grow their business through the provision of expert advice across key points within a business lifecycle and;
 - Connections through providing a participant with credible and trusted contacts across priority Commonwealth markets
- access to a program of webinars (minimum 1 per month across the duration of the program) which will include:
 - Market access information across priority Commonwealth international and state markets:
 - Insight to emerging trends and developments across the priority sectors identified by the CWF Market sponsor
- the provision of a contracted number of hours access to a business coach who will support the program participant in developing their business plan and planning their growth across the business lifecycle and into new markets.
- each participant will be provided with an opportunity to attend at least one CWEIC-led trade mission per cohort. The location of this Trade Mission will be agreed with the Market Sponsor and it is proposed that the Trade Missions for CWF Queensland could be targeted towards the India Market:
 - The trade missions will be designed to support the needs of the programme participants, once finalised. Participation on a trade-mission will incur an additional fee:
 - The trade missions will be populated from across CWEIC's international strategic partner network, wider CWF programmes (for example India and UK) and to agreed stakeholders and partners from outside of CWEIC's direct network:
 - Participants will be supported in the construction of their programme and meeting contacts and;

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- A trade mission will (whenever possible) be timed to coincide with a key international event/ trade show within the target market/ priority sectors
- Direct access to ever increasing network of CWF programme participants from across key Commonwealth markets. The aspiration is to build this network of prequalified and credible businesses to a network of 400 participants by CBF 2020;
- Direct access to and participation with CWEIC's high-profile programme of events, including the 2020 Commonwealth Business Forum and;
- The ability to utilise the CWF brand and logo to augment the participants business identity and international credibility/ connectiveness.

Wherever possible CWEIC will deliver commitments through Digital Solutions. This reflects CWEIC's recognition of the need to minimise the cost in time, financial and resource to a business in travelling.

15: CommonwealthFirst Queensland: Who is the Ideal Participant?

The final criteria will be agreed with the Market Sponsor. As a guide CommonwealthFirst looks for credible and exciting businesses with high export potential and as a guideline the following broad characteristics could be targeted:

- Established businesses who are moving towards the Expansion stage of the Start-Up lifecycle; with characteristics provisionally including;
 - Proven experience/ capability across the priority sectors:
 - Turnover between AUS\$250,000 and AUS\$100,000,000
 - Employees between 10 and 250
 - Demonstrable Revenue growth; with an aspiration of 20% over the last 2 years and:
 - Represent the broader Queensland; including Regional Queensland
- A business who is looking to expand into another Commonwealth market. This includes both:
 - Those looking to start exporting to another Commonwealth market and/ or and;
 - Those currently exporting to a Commonwealth market and looking to expand operations into additional Commonwealth markets;

These parameters are only indicative. CommonwealthFirst Queensland will look to recruit a wide range of small and medium sized businesses, from early stage start-ups to businesses that are well established in Queensland and are potentially operating in overseas markets but have not fulfilled their export potential.

16: Commonwealth Queensland: An High-level activity plan

Recognising that the timing and focus of CWF Queensland will be developed in partnership with the CWF: Queensland Sponsor, the table below is intended to provide an indicate view of high level timings and activities only.

17: Partnership

The programme will be a partnership between the Government of Queensland, the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council (CWEIC) and CommonwealthFirst Queensland. CWEIC will retain ownership and the IP of the CommonwealthFirst brand.

The Queensland Government will provide support through a combination of in-kind support and through leveraging existing funding programs to support Queensland exporters. We will continue to work closely with all State Government agencies including the Premier's Office, Trade and Investment Queensland, Advance Queensland, Business Queensland, Economic Development Queensland and Queensland's diplomatic network (particularly the Agent General in London), as well as national agencies such as Austrade, Regional Development Agencies (RDAs), TradeStart and relevant municipal authorities.

Additional partners and sponsors of the programme will be identified to assist in funding and, equally importantly, mentoring the Export Champions.

Similarly, CWEIC will continue to work closely with other Queensland based initiatives and organisations, such as Life Sciences Queensland, Queensland's Chief Entrepreneur and River City Labs. We will also work closely with international initiatives such as Pitch@Palace whose Australian arm is led from Queensland and where Queensland has had a proven track record of success, including winners across 2017 and 2018.

18: Governance

A programme board will be established to oversee the delivery of CommonwealthFirst Queensland.

Non-executive board members will be unpaid, but reasonable expenses will be paid on a pre-agreed basis. The board will have quarterly calls and will meet once a year to help develop the strategy for the programme and to monitor performance.

The board will be expanded as necessary, possibly with the addition of a non-statutory advisory board, and we are keen to ensure gender balance as well as state-wide representations. Sponsors will also be represented on the board/advisory board as appropriate

19: Web-site

The programme will be supported by a website and an online platform to facilitate networking between the Export Champions and the wider CommonwealthFirst community. CWF Queensland will benefit from the UK CWF Pilot, which has already established a web-

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site and brand. CWF Queensland will also be supported by a CWF LinkedIn network and an enduring alumni strategy.

20: Mentoring and Training

The participating companies will have access to a dedicated mentor and team of specialist advisers with skills in relevant areas including market entry, export finance, shipping, law, accountancy etc.

The mentors and advisers will help the Export Champions develop their Commonwealth Export Strategy and identify suitable opportunities for them. The Queensland specific mentors and advisers will be selected during the first phase of the project and will be matched to specific companies.

Queensland Export Champions will also be able to draw on the international network of the CommonwealthFirst mentors. 40 mentors have been recruited to date http://www.commonwealthfirst.org/about/mentors/.

Commonwealth Export Champions will also have access to CWEIC network of Country Directors –as well as our 70 strong network of corporate and institutional strategic partners from across the Commonwealth and beyond:

This international network of mentors will compliment, support and add-value to Queensland's existing International Business Advisory Network, as established per Queensland's Trade and Investment Strategy.

The mentors and advisers are not paid and expenses are only be paid on a pre-agreed basis. We do not disallow the advisers from establishing a commercial relationship with the Export Champions as long as this is transparent and this is reported to us.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that you **sign** the letter at **Attachment 1** advising the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council (CWEIC) prior to your upcoming trade mission to the United Arab Emirates, Germany and the United Kingdom (UK) from 5 to 16 April 2019, that the Queensland Government has declined its CommonwealthFirst (CWF) Queensland proposal which was initially raised in 2018.

KEY ISSUES

- In January 2018, you received a proposal by the CWEIC seeking funding of \$500 000 per year for three years to support the CWEIC CWF Queensland proposal (Attachment 2), which would select leading small and medium enterprises to become Export Champions across the Commonwealth.
- The proposal was a CWEIC suggestion as a legacy for the Commonwealth Games.
 The Queensland Government did not support the proposal but as CWEIC is yet to receive a response, a letter to Lord Marland of Odstock, Chairman of the CWEIC Advisory Council, would close off on this request prior to your visit to the UK in April.
- The CWEIC CWF proposal did not demonstrate how services that were proposed under the program provided additional value to those already being funded by the Queensland Government through the Advancing Queensland Trade and Investment Strategy 2017–2022.
- In January 2019, Lord Marland met with the Honourable George Brandis, Australian High Commissioner and the Agent-General to discuss the Australian Federal Government support for CWF as part of the Commonwealth Games Legacy.
- The Queensland Government remains committed to the CWEIC relationship as a strategic partner since January 2017, as recommended by former Agent-General Mr Ken Smith. It is through this platform that Trade and Investment Queensland (TIQ) sees the benefit of leveraging the CWEIC contacts across the Commonwealth to help position Queensland.)
- The Agent-General, Ms Linda Apelt, has developed a strong relationship with senior members of the CWEIC, enabling TIQ Europe to progress discussions on how Queensland might take a more strategic approach to harnessing trade and investment opportunities across the Commonwealth.

• CONSULTATION

 The Agent-General supports use of the Queensland Government's strategic partnership through the renewal of membership, and in-kind support if the Federal Government agrees to fund the CWF proposal.

BACKGROUND

- The CWEIC is aligned to the Commonwealth Heads of Government to promote intra-Commonwealth trade and investment and the role of the private sector across the 52-member countries. It is responsible for the Commonwealth Business Forum alongside the biennial meetings of the Commonwealth Heads of Government and Commonwealth Trade Ministers.
- You were invited by the CWEIC to attend the Commonwealth Trade Ministers Meeting to promote Queensland, *Trade2018* and the Games, which took place in March 2017. Several other meetings ensued between CWEIC representatives and/or Queensland Government representatives in London, in the lead up to and during the Games, when the CWEIC led a delegation and participated in *Trade2018* activities.
- TIQ recently renewed the Queensland Government's 2019 CWEIC Strategic Partnership at a cost of 10 000 pounds (approximately A\$18 000) as at 19 February 2019.
- The CWEIC strategic membership provides a platform to promote Queensland and encourage UK businesses to look at opportunities in Queensland. The CWEIC contacts are a useful channel for the promotion of Queensland capability in the lead up to other major events such as the Dubai Expo 2020 and Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games.
- The CWEIC has identified India as a key export and investment market for its strategic partners. The TIQ Commissioner for India recently participated in the CWEIC business mission to India, and a second mission to India is being planned.
- As a CWEIC Strategic Partner, TIQ has gained access to key influencers across the Commonwealth which would otherwise have been difficult to access. The CWEIC also has strong links to African markets and the Asia Pacific Commonwealth markets which, in the future, TIQ will be able to leverage if it continues its strategic partnership.

1.0: CommonwealthFirst

1.1: CommonwealthFirst (CWF) is a programme established by the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council (CWEIC) to grow Intra-Commonwealth trade by supporting Small and Medium Enterprises to export confidently to new Commonwealth markets.

1.2: CWF has two primary objectives, to support:

- Governments and their commercial partners in increasing their volume of exports and;
- SME's to expand their operations and grow into new Commonwealth markets. Opportunities include facilitated trade missions and also 1-2-1 technical support and mentoring.

2.0 The Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council

2.1: CWEIC is the Commonwealth's business organisation chaired by Lord Marland, who served as Prime Minister David Cameron's Trade Envoy. CWEIC has a mandate from Commonwealth Heads of Government to promote trade, investment and the role of the private sector.

2.2: CWF provides a structured approach to maximising the unique trading opportunities presented by the Commonwealth, in-particular the:

- Size and demography of the Commonwealth: With the 53 nations of the Commonwealth representing over one-third of the World's population and the trading opportunities presented by the Commonwealth's exponentially increasing middle-class. This has seen Commonwealth trade continue to grow at a time of increasing world uncertainty and;
- The Commonwealth Business Advantage: Where the consistency of language, legal systems and financial systems across the Commonwealth has been shown to present a 19% trading advantage for Intra-Commonwealth trade.

3.0 CWEIC and Queensland: A Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games Legacy

The CWEIC and Queensland Government is a relationship cemented through GC2018 and one that continues to offer value to date; for example:

- Providing Queensland Government with internationally high-profile opportunities; for example speaking opportunities at the 2017 Commonwealth Trade Ministers Meeting and 2018 Commonwealth Business Forum;
- Supporting Queensland Government in developing emerging industries; for example providing speakers and delegates to the LifeScience Queensland led Commonwealth Innovation Forum and committing to grow this forum to an established Commonwealth platform;
- Helping to connect Queensland to the Commonwealth and vice-versa. For example CWEIC brought the single-largest international delegation to support the *Trade 2018* program and is committed to continuing this engagement through to the forthcoming Qode Event and;
- Providing Trade and Investment Queensland with valuable connections across CWEIC's Strategic Partner network (for example Arup) and Queensland companies with opportunities; for example in attending CWEIC's recent Rwanda Mining Event

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4.0 CommonwealthFirst: The Story-to-date and the Next Steps: 2019-21

Leanne Kemp: CEO Everledger (CWF Export Champion) and Queensland's Chief Entrepreneur

4.1: The CWF Program was launched at the CWEIC led 2015 Commonwealth Business Forum (CBF), in Malta. CWF was piloted through four cohorts of SME's totalling 100 business across 2016 – 2018; with key highlights including the:

- Recruitment of 100 business across the pilot. Whilst the pilot was trialled with the UK market in-mind, its participants were international in nature;
- Delivery of 17 CWF export focused events including a Commonwealth Export Day and a Commonwealth First International Festival of Business;
- Delivery of 2 targeted Trade Missions per year for CWF participants to 6 priority Commonwealth markets including: Canada, Malaysia, Singapore, India and Australia. The CWF program continues in 2019 with a return to the indian market through CWEIC's role as a Partner Organisation to the 'Vibrant Gujarat' Global Summit in January 2019;
- Recruitment and appointment of a high level and international business mentor network (currently comprising over 40 international business leaders) to provide expertise and insight on an unique 1-2-1 basis for program participants and;
- There were also business specific outcomes for cohort members; for example:
 - Playdale increased experts to the Commonwealth by 492% and;
 - Everledger, a Queensland based enterprise who joined the UK cohort to leverage the opportunities presented by CWF. These included participating in a number of the CWF trade missions; including those to India, where Everledger used the connections generated by CWEIC to establish operations; Canada where Series A funding of over £10mUS was attracted and to Queensland; where the founder, Leanne Kemp was a keynote speaker to Trade 2018 and the Commonwealth Innovation Forum.

4.2: Commonwealth First 19-21:

Building on the successful pilot CWEIC has two linked priorities for CWF across 19-21:

- Expand the CWF network to create a trusted community of credible SME's that stretches
 across the Commonwealth. The aspiration is to build the CWF business network to over
 1,000 business by the time of the 2020 CBF; with a CWF presence for all priority
 Commonwealth markets. CWEIC is actively developing CWF networks in the UK, Malta,
 Australia, Malaysia, Nigeria and India, and;
- Ensure that the CWF international networks are expanded in a co-ordinated way with a real synergy of opportunity across the network; for example CWF networks are being developed around:

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- Shared Commonwealth priority sectors for example innovation; with these sectors having been identified to reflect both priorities across the Commonwealth and also to enhance existing Queensland Government strategies and programmes. For example Advance Queensland and Advancing Trade and Investment: Queensland's Trade and Investment Strategy, and;
- Broader themes to help countries meet the Commonwealth's Sustainable
 Development Goals; for example around Gender Equality (SDG 5) and Economic
 Growth (SDG 8)

5: Commonwealth First: Queensland

5.1: Following The Honourable Annastacia Palaszczuk, MP, Premier of Queensland in principle support, formal approval is sought from the Queensland Government for CWF Queensland, which is proposed to:

- CWF can be built to the participant numbers required by the Market Sponsor;
- CWF has a per participant cost of \$4,922AD per participant
- It is recommended that a minimum program would be:
 - o 2 * Cohorts of 10 per year; 60 participants across the 3-years: \$295,320
- Current planning for CWF Queensland envisages the delivery of 2 cohorts of 40 Queensland Export Champions per year; for each of the 3 years, supporting 240 Queensland business export to new and priority markets;
 - This number is concept only, with the CWF network being able to be scaled up or down depending on the market sponsors' preference
- Cost:
 - \$4,922AD per participant;
 - Program cost across 3 years * 240 participants: \$1,181,248
 - Annex A: Provides more detail of costs

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- Demonstrable Revenue growth; with an aspiration of 20% over the last 2 years and;
- Represent the broader Queensland; including Regional Queensland
- A business who is looking to expand into another Commonwealth market. This includes both:
 - Those looking to start exporting to another Commonwealth market and/ or and:
 - Those currently exporting to a Commonwealth market and looking to expand operations into additional Commonwealth markets;

These parameters are only indicative. CommonwealthFirst Queensland will look to recruit a wide range of small and medium sized businesses, from early stage start-ups to businesses that are well established in Queensland and are potentially operating in overseas markets but have not fulfilled their export potential.

5.7: Commonwealth Queensland: An High-level activity plan

Recognising that the timing and focus of CWF Queensland will be developed in partnership with the CWF: Queensland Sponsor, the table below is intended to provide an indicate view of high level timings and activities only.

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6.0 Partnership

The programme will be a partnership between the Government of Queensland, the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council (CWEIC) and CommonwealthFirst Queensland. CWEIC will retain ownership and the IP of the CommonwealthFirst brand.

The Queensland Government will provide support through a combination of in-kind support and through leveraging existing funding programs to support Queensland exporters. We will continue to work closely with all State Government agencies including the Premier's Office. Trade and Investment Queensland, Advance Queensland, Business Queensland, Economic Development Queensland and Queensland's diplomatic network (particularly the Agent General in London), as well as national agencies such as Austrade, Regional Development Agencies (RDAs), TradeStart and relevant municipal authorities.

Additional partners and sponsors of the programme will be identified to assist in funding and, equally importantly, mentoring the Export Champions.

Similarly, CWEIC will continue to work closely with other Queensland based initiatives and organisations, such as Life Sciences Queensland, Queensland's Chief Entrepreneur and River City Labs. We will also work closely with international initiatives such as Pitch@Palace whose Australian arm is led from Queensland and where Queensland has had a proven track record of success, including winners across 2017 and 2018.

7.0 Governance

A programme board will be established to oversee the delivery of CommonwealthFirst Queensland.

Non-executive board members will be unpaid, but reasonable expenses will be paid on a pre-agreed basis. The board will have quarterly calls and will meet once a year to help develop the strategy for the programme and to monitor performance.

The board will be expanded as necessary, possibly with the addition of a non-statutory advisory board, and we are keen to ensure gender balance as well as state-wide representations. Sponsors will also be represented on the board/advisory board as appropriate.

8.0 Web-site

The programme will be supported by a website and an online platform to facilitate networking between the Export Champions and the wider CommonwealthFirst community. CWF Queensland will benefit from the UK CWF Pilot, which has already established a web-site and brand. CWF Queensland will also be supported by a CWF LinkedIn network and an enduring alumni strategy.

9.0 Mentoring and Training

The participating companies will have access to a dedicated mentor and team of specialist advisers with skills in relevant areas including market entry, export finance, shipping, law, accountancy etc.

The mentors and advisers will help the Export Champions develop their Commonwealth Export Strategy and identify suitable opportunities for them. The Queensland specific mentors and advisers will be selected during the first phase of the project and will be matched to specific companies.

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Queensland Export Champions will also be able to draw on the international network of the CommonwealthFirst mentors. 40 mentors have been recruited to date http://www.commonwealthfirst.org/about/mentors/.

Commonwealth Export Champions will also have access to CWEIC network of Country Directors —as well as our 70 strong network of corporate and institutional strategic partners from across the Commonwealth and beyond:

This international network of mentors will compliment, support and add-value to Queensland's existing International Business Advisory Network, as established per Queensland's Trade and Investment Strategy.

The mentors and advisers are not paid and expenses are only be paid on a pre-agreed basis. We do not disallow the advisers from establishing a commercial relationship with the Export Champions as long as this is transparent and this is reported to us.

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CommonwealthFirst: Queensland

1.0: CommonwealthFirst

CommonwealthFirst (CWF) is a programme established by the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council (CWEIC) to grow Intra-Commonwealth trade by supporting Small and Medium Enterprises to export confidently to new Commonwealth markets.

CWF has two primary objectives, to support:

- Governments and their commercial partners in increasing their volume of Commonwealth exports and;
- SME's to expand their operations and grow into new Commonwealth markets.

 Opportunities include facilitated trade missions and also 1-2-1 technical support and mentoring.

2.0: The Proposition Details

- CWF can be built to the participant numbers required by the Market Sponsor;
- The CWF Queensland program is proposed to constitute 30 businesses a year, for 3 years (90 businesses) overall at a total 3-year cost of \$572,952 or £314,820
 - A full budget breakdown is available as required.

Further details of the proposition, the ambition, priorities and outcomes are outlined in paragraphs 10 - 12.

3.0 The Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council

CWEIC is the Commonwealth's business organisation chaired by Lord Marland, who served as Prime Minister David Cameron's Trade Envoy. CWEIC has a mandate from Commonwealth Heads of Government to promote trade, investment and the role of the private sector. CWEIC's Chief Executive is Mr Alan Gemmell (OBE), who joined CWEIC in December 2018 from his role as Director of the British Council in India. Mr Gemmell brings to CWEIC his vast experience and connections across the Indian business and government communities.

CWEIC has close to 80 Strategic Partners from over 20 Commonwealth countries; including both Australia and India, By 2021 CWEIC will have grown this business network to 180 Strategic Partners; providing access, insight and influence across the Commonwealth with a focus on business-to-Government engagement.

CWEIC currently has established international operations in 6 priority Commonwealth markets; including the UK (including a particular focus on the City of London), Malaysia, Singapore, Nigeria, Malta and Sri Lanka. CWEIC has also recently signed a MoU with the Government of Gujarat and is currently working to further develop its presence across India and to further develop its international operations across Australia and the Pacific, the Caribbean (through a recent partnership established with the Government of the Cayman Islands) and East Africa, as CWEIC looks forward to delivering the Commonwealth Business Forum in Rwanda, in 2020.

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4: CWEIC and India:

With a population of over 2.4 billion and a combined GDP that is projected to continue to grow to UKS \$13 trillion by 2020, the Commonwealth maintains a global relevance to trade. The Commonwealth represents over one-third of the world's population and will contain over 40% of the global workforce in the next two years. Of the Commonwealth's 2.4 billion people over 60% are under 30, with a burgeoning middle class consumer base that will reach one billion over the next 2 years. Significantly, India's path of growth is set to see India become the world's largest economy behind China by 2050, with an economy 60 times that of Queensland's.

Recognising the importance of fostering relationships and collaboration in the Indian market CWEIC continues to develop a strong Strategic Partner network across India. CWEIC has prioritised both Government and Institutional partners with whom CWEIC is already developing collaborative programming. For example CWEIC signed a MoU to deliver a CommonwealthFirst network with the Government of Gujarat. Two of CWEIC's Strategic Partners exemplify the strength of this network and include:

Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI):

- Established in 1927, FICCI is the largest and oldest apex business organisation in India. FICCI is the voice of India's business and industry. From influencing policy to encouraging debate, engaging with policy makers and civil society, FICCI articulates the views and concerns of industry. It serves its members from the Indian private and public corporate sectors and multinational companies, drawing its strength from diverse regional chambers of commerce and industry across states, reaching out to over 2,50,000 companies. FICCI provides a platform for networking and consensus building within and across sectors and is the first port of call for Indian industry, policy makers and the international business community and;
- CWEIC is currently working with FICCI as an in-market partner for taking forward CWF proposals and market connections across a series of Indian states including those Indian states of priority to Queensland including; Gujarat, West Bengal, Telangana, Karnataka and Banglaru.

Confederation of Indian Industry (CII):

- The Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) works to create and sustain an environment conducive to the development of India, partnering industry, Government, and civil society, through advisory and consultative processes. Founded in 1895, CII has around 9000 members, from the private as well as public sectors, including SMEs and MNCs, and an indirect membership of over 300,000 enterprises from around 276 national and regional sectoral industry bodies.
- with thought leaders, and enhancing efficiency, competitiveness and business opportunities for industry through a range of specialized services and strategic global linkages. It also provides a platform for consensus-building and networking on key issues and;
- With 65 offices, including 9 Centres of Excellence, in India, and 10 overseas offices in Australia, China, Egypt, France, Germany, Singapore, South Africa, UAE, UK, and USA, as well as institutional partnerships with 355 counterpart organizations in 126 countries, CII serves as a reference point for Indian industry and the international

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business community. CWEIC is currently working CII to develop CWF proposals for Indian States that includes Maharashtra and Delhi.

5: CWEIC's Recent Successes in India

CWEIC further developed its profile and relationships in India with an extremely successful trade mission to 'Vibrant Gujarat'. Due to the size and scale of CWEIC's delegation (of over 75 senior business and Government leaders), was CWEIC recognised as an official event partner. 'Vibrant Gujarat' saw CWEIC successfully establish a Memorandum of Understanding with the Government of Gujarat to progress a Strategic Partnership and a CWEIC: CommonwealthFirst Program. Following 'Vibrant Gujarat' CWEIC is currently working to develop matching proposals for seven other priority Indian states. Of particular interest to the Queensland Government will be CWEIC's partnership proposals with the Indian State Government's of West Bengal, Bengaluru, Karnataka, Maharashtra and Telangana; all states identified by the Queensland Government as representing priority opportunities. CWEIC's progress in India, alongside the development of its operations and Strategic Partner base across the wider-Africa has ensured that CWEIC has unique government and business connections across two of the world's largest and fasted growing economies.

6.0 CWEIC and Queensland: A Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games Legacy

The CWEIC and Queensland Government is a relationship cemented through GC2018 and one that continues to offer value to-date; for example:

- Providing Queensland Government with internationally high-profile opportunities; for example speaking opportunities at the 2017 Commonwealth Trade Ministers Meeting and 2018 Commonwealth Business Forum;
- Supporting Queensland Government in developing emerging industries; for example providing speakers and delegates to the LifeScience Queensland led Commonwealth Innovation Forum and committing to grow this forum to an established Commonwealth platform;
- Helping to connect Queensland to the Commonwealth and vice-versa. For example CWEIC brought the single-largest international delegation to support the *Trade 2018* program;
- Providing Trade and Investment Queensland with valuable connections across CWEIC's Strategic Partner network (for example Arup) and Queensland companies with opportunities; for example in attending CWEIC's recent Rwanda Mining Event and:
- Work is also underway with the Office of Queensland's Chief Entreprenuer (in coordination with TIQ Europe and London) to deliver a Commonwealth and Queensland Technology event. This will be timed with the London Tech Week (June 2019) and support Queensland's (and the wider Australia) delegation to LTW.

7: CommonwealthFirst: An Overview

CWF provides a structured approach to maximising the unique trading opportunities presented by the Commonwealth, in-particular the:

 Size and demography of the Commonwealth: With the 53 nations of the Commonwealth representing over one-third of the World's population and the trading

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opportunities presented by the Commonwealth's exponentially increasing middleclass. The scale and potential of the Commonwealth is well represented by India, which by 2050 is expected to have a population that will be almost 60 times of Queensland's. This has seen Commonwealth trade continue to grow at a time of increasing world uncertainty and;

 The Commonwealth Business Advantage: Where the consistency of language, legal systems and financial systems across the Commonwealth has been shown to present a 19% trading advantage for Intra-Commonwealth trade.

8: CommonwealthFirst: The Story-to-date and the Next Steps: 2019-21

'Through Commonwealth First, Everledger has been able to cement its UK operations and successfully expand into India'.

Leanne Kemp: CEO Everledger (CWF Export Champion) and Queensland's Chief Entrepreneur

The CWF Program was launched at the CWEIC led 2015 Commonwealth Business Forum (CBF), in Malta. CWF was piloted through four cohorts of SME's totalling 100 business across 2016 – 2018; with key highlights including the:

- Recruitment of 100 business across the pilot. Whilst the pilot was trialled with the UK
 market in-mind, its participants were international in nature;
- Delivery of 17 CWF export focused events including a Commonwealth Export Day and a Commonwealth First International Festival of Business;
- Delivery of 2 targeted Trade Missions per year for CWF participants to 6 priority Commonwealth markets including: Canada, Malaysia, Singapore, India and Australia. The CWF program continues in 2019 with a return to the Indian market through CWEIC's role as a Partner Organisation to the 'Vibrant Gujarat' Global Summit in January 2019;
- Recruitment and appointment of a high level and international business mentor network (currently comprising over 40 international business leaders) to provide expertise and insight on an unique 1-2-1 basis for program participants and;
- There were also business specific outcomes for cohort members; for example:
 - Playdale increased exports to the Commonwealth by 492% and;
 - Everledger, a Queensland based enterprise who joined the UK cohort to leverage the opportunities presented by CWF. These included participating in a number of the CWF trade missions; including those to India, where Everledger used the connections generated by CWEIC to establish operations; Canada where Series A funding of over £10mUS was attracted and to Queensland; where the founder, Leanne Kemp was a keynote speaker to Trade 2018 and the Commonwealth Innovation Forum.

9: CommonwealthFirst 19-21:

Building on the successful pilot CWEIC has two linked priorities for CWF across 19-21:

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- Expand the CWF network to create a trusted community of credible SME's that stretches across the Commonwealth. The aspiration is to build the CWF business network to over 400 business by the time of the 2020 CBF; with a CWF presence for all priority Commonwealth markets. CWEIC is actively developing CWF networks in the UK, Malta, Australia, Malaysia, Nigeria and India, and;
- Ensure that the CWF international networks are expanded in a co-ordinated way with a real synergy of opportunity across the network; for example CWF networks are being developed around:
 - Shared Commonwealth priority sectors for example innovation; with these sectors having been identified to reflect both priorities across the Commonwealth and also to enhance existing Queensland Government strategies and programmes. For example Advance Queensland and Advancing Trade and Investment: Queensland's Trade and Investment Strategy, and Queensland – India Trade and Investment Strategy (ITIS): 2018 – 2023, and;
 - Broader themes to help countries meet the Commonwealth's Sustainable Development Goals; for example around Gender Equality (SDG 5) and Economic Growth (SDG 8)

10: Commonwealth First: Queensland: The India Market Opportunity

Following a discussion between The Honourable Annastacia Palaszczuk, MP, Premier of Queensland and CWEIC, CWF Queensland is designed with a focus on the Indian market. CWF Queensland is designed to support the Government of Queensland's objective of maintaining its position within Australia as having the largest share of exports to India, enhancing market understanding and increasing investment from India:

As outlined in Paragraph 12 CWF will deliver a series of structured activities that will directly support two of the priority targets within Queensland's ITIS:

Increasing the number of opportunities facilitated by Queensland Government by 50% over the next 5 years and;

Increasing the total exports from Queensland to India by 50% over the next 5 years.

CWF Queensland is designed to directly support Queensland Governments' ITIS Key Initiatives, specifically:

- Elevate Queensland's Profile in India through CWF Queensland by:
 - Strengthening Queensland's reputation across priority sectors and support the Commonwealth's Government 'Brand Australia' Programme. CWF cohorts will be recruited against sectors of mutual priority between Queensland and India identified through the ITIS. It is proposed that CWF Queensland will target innovation across the following sectors: Education and Ed Tech, Training, METs (and Renewable Energy), Food & Ag and Healthcare;
 - Providing a focal point for Queensland businesses to increase their understanding of key in-market events and forums, and;
 - Targeting CWF: Queensland Trade Missions to increase Queensland's presence at major Indian conferences to India. CWEIC will build from a position of strength as an Official Partner to Vibrant Gujarat 2019 and ensure that CWF Trade Missions are timed to coincide with major in-market trade events. With timings and opportunities guided by CWEIC's network of Strategic Partners and State Government partners;

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- Build the Capability of Queensland's business community to successfully operate in India by:
 - Putting in place a structured approach to maximise the opportunities presented by CWEIC's Strategic Partner network to Queensland, with a particular priority of supporting TIQ: India's in-market presence. In particular CWEIC will ensure that TIQ is introduced to CII and FICCI and that opportunities are provided to brief/ debrief CWF participants, pre and post Trade Missions;
 - Utilising CWEIC's Strategic Partner network to support TIQ in facilitating
 Queensland businesses 'landing' in India. For example CWEIC is currently working
 with FICCI to explore the opportunity for shared meeting space for CWF
 participants; an opportunity that would be extended to CWF Queensland
 participants;
 - CWEIC has established a strong social media presence following its successful Vibrant Gujarat mission. CWF success stories and Trade Missions will be proactively communicated across CWEIC's; media channels, priority events and strategic partner network and;
 - CWEIC proposes to work with the Government of Queensland to scope a Queensland in India event that could form part of the programming for the 2020 Commonwealth Business Forum. This could provide a great opportunity to add prestige, international awareness and momentum to Queensland's ITIS commitment to developing an annual Queensland India trade event. The participation of CWF Queensland members would demonstrate Queensland's growth and credibility across the Indian market to a global audience of senior business and government leaders.
- Develop Queensland's Market Intelligence and understanding of the opportunities presented across the Indian market by:
 - CWEIC leveraging its Strategic Partner network to provide market access and sector insight sessions across the priority Indian states identified in para 4 for CWF Queensland participants (alongside additional Commonwealth country market and sector webinars as part of the wider participant package). This will see CWF participants receive a minimum of 1 targeted market and/ or sector webinar being delivered per month. CWF Queensland participants will be able to continue to access CWF webinars post-program completion. CWEIC will prioritise digital channel delivery to provide a more efficient delivery system and the collation of more effective customer intelligence and;
 - CWEIC will work with both Queensland Government and its wider Strategic Partner network to support Queensland in its priority of developing market intelligence reports. In particular to maximise the wealth of material and insight already produced by partners such as FICCI and CII, plus CWEIC's Government partners.
- Prioritising the development of a long term relationship between the Queensland Government, CWF Queensland Participants and CWEIC's Strategic Partners who prioritise the Indian market. A particular priority will be placed on early engagement with CWEIC's Institutional Strategic Partners from India, CII and FICCI. Specific opportunities will be sought to provide opportunities for businesses to meet, connect and network;

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- Providing CWF participants with the ability to directly connect with wider CWF networks through CWEIC's app that will be rolled out to SP's and CWF participants from August 2019. This app will enable participants to directly communicate and to build a long lasting alumni network for CWF participants so they can build long term connections and networks;
- CWEIC prioritising Queensland as a market of opportunity within the CWF India State Government proposals and in particular identify Queensland as a priority location for their trade missions. This will help bring targeted delegations of Indian businesses to Queensland to support the Queensland Government in establishing contact with Indian businesses who have an interest in Australia with a view to establishing an office in Queensland. A provisional target could see CWEIC bringing 25 Indian businesses per year to visit Queensland as part of reciprocal CWF trade missions. Where possible/ desirable this would be timed with major Queensland events; for example Qode/;
- Each member of the CWF Queensland will receive a coach targeted to the requirements of the business. For those businesses prioritising the Indian market, CWEIC will seek to provide a coach with the requisite market expertise to support those Queensland businesses seeking to grow their operations into India. The international nature of CWEIC's mentor network will also enable CWF India participants to be able to better understand and embrace reciprocal opportunities within Queensland. This will also provide an opportunity to collaborate and add value to TIQ's work in establishing the proposed Queensland India mentor network as per the ITIS.
- Supporting Queensland in setting up partnerships and MoU's with priority Indian states and;
- CWF Queensland will provide a structured approach that will directly assist
 Queensland's aspiration of developing a program that will support collaboration to
 develop collaboration across priority industries between Queensland and India.

11: The Proposition Details

- CWF can be built to the participant numbers required by the Market Sponsor;
- CWF Queensland is proposed to consist of:
 - 1 cohort of 30 participants per year;
 - 90 participants across the 3 years at a total cost of AD \$6,366 or £3,498 per participant \$572,952 or £314,820 and;
 - A full budget breakdown is available as required.

CWF Queensland will:

- Deliver from Day 1; with the announcement confirming cohort 1 participants;
- Identify participants from across Queensland through regional and sector based roadshows;
- Ensure its selection process is both competitive and transparent; to ensure that only high quality participants, who will be actively engaged with the scheme are selected and;
- Support and add value to Queensland Government Agencies, Programmes & Strategies including, Advance Queensland and Advancing Trade and Investment: Queensland's Trade and Investment Strategy

14: CommonwealthFirst Queensland: The Participant Value Proposition

CWF Queensland participants will receive the following commitments:

- a briefing conversation with CWEIC within two weeks of joining the programme to ensure that CWEIC are clear as to the participants priorities and requirements in joining the program
- access to a dedicated network of senior and impactful contacts who will provide:
 - Insight to support participants in accessing and entering new markets, with India being a clear priority;
 - o Influence to support participants in being able to rapidly expand an in-market presence;
 - Insight to support a participant grow their business idea;
 - Insight to support a participant grow their business through the provision of expert advice across key points within a business lifecycle and;
 - o Connections through providing a participant with credible and trusted contacts across priority Commonwealth markets
- access to a program of webinars (minimum 1 per month across the duration of the program) which will include:
 - Market access information across priority Commonwealth international and state markets;
 - Insight to emerging trends and developments across the priority sectors identified by the CWF Market sponsor
- the provision of a contracted number of hours access to a business coach who will support the program participant in developing their business plan and planning their growth across the business lifecycle and into new markets.
- each participant will be provided with an opportunity to attend at least one CWEIC-led trade mission per cohort. The location of this Trade Mission will be agreed with the Market Sponsor and it is proposed that the Trade Missions for CWF Queensland could be targeted towards the India Market:
 - The trade missions will be designed to support the needs of the programme participants, once finalised. Participation on a trade-mission will incur an additional fee:
 - The trade missions will be populated from across CWEIC's international strategic partner network, wider CWF programmes (for example India and UK) and to agreed stakeholders and partners from outside of CWEIC's direct network;
 - Participants will be supported in the construction of their programme and meeting contacts and;

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- A trade mission will (whenever possible) be timed to coincide with a key international event/ trade show within the target market/ priority sectors
- Direct access to ever increasing network of CWF programme participants from across key Commonwealth markets. The aspiration is to build this network of prequalified and credible businesses to a network of 400 participants by CBF 2020;
- Direct access to and participation with CWEIC's high-profile programme of events, including the 2020 Commonwealth Business Forum and;
- The ability to utilise the CWF brand and logo to augment the participants' business identity and international credibility/ connectiveness.

Wherever possible CWEIC will deliver commitments through Digital Solutions. This reflects CWEIC's recognition of the need to minimise the cost in time, financial and resource to a business in travelling.

15: CommonwealthFirst Queensland: Who is the Ideal Participant?

The final criteria will be agreed with the Market Sponsor. As a guide CommonwealthFirst looks for credible and exciting businesses with high export potential and as a guideline the following broad characteristics could be targeted:

- Established businesses who are moving towards the Expansion stage of the Start-Up lifecycle; with characteristics provisionally including;
 - Proven experience/ capability across the priority sectors:
 - Turnover between AUS\$250,000 and AUS\$100,000,000
 - Employees between 19 and 250
 - Demonstrable Reverue growth; with an aspiration of 20% over the last 2 years and;
 - Represent the broader Queensland; including Regional Queensland
- A business who is looking to expand into another Commonwealth market. This includes both:
 - Those looking to start exporting to another Commonwealth market and/ or and;
 - Those currently exporting to a Commonwealth market and looking to expand operations into additional Commonwealth markets;

These parameters are only indicative. CommonwealthFirst Queensland will look to recruit a wide range of small and medium sized businesses, from early stage start-ups to businesses that are well established in Queensland and are potentially operating in overseas markets but have not fulfilled their export potential.

17: Partnership

The programme will be a partnership between the Government of Queensland, the Commonwealth Enterprise and Investment Council (CWEIC) and CommonwealthFirst Queensland. CWEIC will retain ownership and the IP of the CommonwealthFirst brand.

The Queensland Government will provide support through a combination of in-kind support and through leveraging existing funding programs to support Queensland exporters. We will continue to work closely with all State Government agencies including the Premier's Office, Trade and Investment Queensland, Advance Queensland, Business Queensland, Economic Development Queensland and Queensland's diplomatic network (particularly the Agent General in London), as well as national agencies such as Austrade, Regional Development Agencies (RDAs), TradeStart and relevant municipal authorities.

Additional partners and sponsors of the programme will be identified to assist in funding and, equally importantly, mentoring the Export Champions.

Similarly, CWEIC will continue to work closely with other Queensland based initiatives and organisations, such as Life Sciences Queensland, Queensland's Chief Entrepreneur and River City Labs. We will also work closely with international initiatives such as Pitch@Palace whose Australian arm is led from Queensland and where Queensland has had a proven track record of success, including winners across 2017 and 2018.

18: Governance

A programme board will be established to oversee the delivery of CommonwealthFirst Queensland.

Non-executive board members will be unpaid, but reasonable expenses will be paid on a pre-agreed basis. The board will have quarterly calls and will meet once a year to help develop the strategy for the programme and to monitor performance.

The board will be expanded as necessary, possibly with the addition of a non-statutory advisory board, and we are keen to ensure gender balance as well as state-wide representations. Sponsors will also be represented on the board/advisory board as appropriate.

19: Web-site

The programme will be supported by a website and an online platform to facilitate networking between the Export Champions and the wider CommonwealthFirst community. CWF Queensland will benefit from the UK CWF Pilot, which has already established a web-

CommonwealthFirst

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site and brand. CWF Queensland will also be supported by a CWF LinkedIn network and an enduring alumni strategy.

20: Mentoring and Training

The participating companies will have access to a dedicated mentor and team of specialist advisers with skills in relevant areas including market entry, export finance, shipping, law, accountancy etc.

The mentors and advisers will help the Export Champions develop their Commonwealth Export Strategy and identify suitable opportunities for them. The Queensland specific mentors and advisers will be selected during the first phase of the project and will be matched to specific companies.

Queensland Export Champions will also be able to draw on the international network of the CommonwealthFirst mentors. 40 mentors have been recruited to date http://www.commonwealthfirst.org/about/mentors/.

Commonwealth Export Champions will also have access to CWEIC network of Country Directors –as well as our 70 strong network of corporate and institutional strategic partners from across the Commonwealth and beyond:

This international network of mentors will compliment, support and add-value to Queensland's existing International Business Advisory Network, as established per Queensland's Trade and Investment Strategy.

The mentors and advisers are not paid and expenses are only be paid on a pre-agreed basis. We do not disallow the advisers from establishing a commercial relationship with the Export Champions as long as this is transparent and this is reported to us.


