Media and data intelligence services provided to Queensland Government by a third party provider were compromised due to a successful cyber-attack.

Learnings for the Department include:

- the need to revisit long standing contracts to ensure security considerations and related key performance indicators are included
- o ensuring third party providers have business continuity plans and practices in place, and that providers can provide assurance that continuity of services will be provided
- due to the scale of the attack, staff need to be vigilant about cyber security and attempted phishing
- o documentation of the interim solution used, should a similar situation arise
- o the provision of training to staff to confidently manage contracts
- o clarification over who takes the lead for whole of government contracts when the issue is technology/cyber related

Collaboration between Housing and Public Works, the DPC Procurement Team and DPC IT was excellent.

Other Business

Christopher Smith advised the Committee that an internal audit of the operational effectiveness of DPC's risk management framework will commence on 24 November 2020.

Impact to the business will be minimal. The Internal Audit and Risk Services Audit team will collate documentation for Ernst and Young and will be the main point of contact.
