Yesterday I announced the appointment of Queensland's 18th Chief Justice. The Honourable Tim Carmody. His keen legal mind, professional experience and integrity make him a very qualified candidate for the job, and his life experience will be an asset to the Supreme Court.

New active limbs to help kids






