



Establish a Queensland Productivity Commission (QPC) as an independent body to work with the community, businesses, universities and trade unions to develop policy solutions to lift the State's productivity, improve living standards and drive growth.

Request the QPC, as its first task, to conduct a public inquiry into electricity pricing to investigate short- and long-term options to respond to the significant price increases over recent years.

Defer any future increases in the payroll tax threshold, introduce a 25 per cent payroll tax rebate for employers of apprentices and trainees, and provide a three-year payroll tax holiday to any new companies established in Queensland as a result of Advance Queensland research programs.

Merge the three electricity distribution network businesses (Ergon, Energex and Powerlink) into a single more efficient network business – retaining current headquarters in Townsville, and combine the two electricity generation businesses (CS Energy and Stanwell) into a new generation business.

Support a parliamentary inquiry into the high cost of insurance in the North.

Support the development of a Domestic and Family Violence Prevention Strategy and Government response to the Report from the Taskforce on Domestic and Family Violence in Queensland, and support implementation of the Government response.

Employment

Establish an employment policy unit within Queensland Treasury to provide advice to the Working Queensland Cabinet Committee and Working Queensland Interdepartmental Committee.

Work closely with the Minister for Training and Skills on the establishment of Jobs Queensiand (as an independent statutory body).

Implement measures to ensure that a steady, methodical, disciplined approach is adopted to fiscal policy, which will mean no job cuts in the Queensland Public Service.

Industrial Relations

Improve health, safety and fairness in the workplace, by:

- Establishing a Charter of Queensland Workers' Rights, recognising and protecting fundamental rights of workers, including fair and equitable remuneration, hours of work and forms of leave.
- Progressing actions to restore Queensland's workers' compensation scheme –
 ensuring Queenslanders injured at work get the support and protection they need
 to provide for their families and get back to work (including reinstating injured

 Establish the Industrial Relations Legislative Reform Reference Group, comprising of government, union and academic representatives, to undertake a comprehensive review of Queensland's industrial relations laws and tribunals and provide advice to the Government by December 2015 for industrial relations reform.

Introduce changes to restore the Labour Day public holiday to the first Monday in May, moving the Queen's Birthday public holiday to October.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Partnerships

Convene a Ministerial Roundtable with leaders of all Aboriginal shire councils and Torres Strait Island based councils and with the Local Government Association of Queensland within 100 days.

Address the longstanding historical issue of the need for compensation for wages stolen from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Queenslanders by establishing a special fund of up to \$21 million and a special taskforce to assist and advise the Government in this work.

Work with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities that have Alcohol Management Plans in place to support and assist them with the management of alcohol in their communities.

MINISTERS in the Palaszczuk Government have finally been given their official to-do list, three months after Labor took office.

Following inquiries from The Courier-Mail, Premier Annastacia Palaszczuk last night released the ministerial charter letters for her 13 ministers.

Many of the letter are full of non-specific requirements expected of all ministers.

However, Education Minister Kate Jones has been told she must deliver "the best Commonwealth Games ever".

In a duplicate letter to all ministers dated yesterday, Ms Palaszczuk told each Cabinet member that their department had a "vital role to play".

"Queenslanders have entrusted us with providing a cohesive and stable government, and delivering on the promises we have made," she wrote.

"It is critical that we work hard to prove ourselves worthy of the trust bestowed on us."

The letters come a day after Ms Palaszczuk released a glossy brochure detailing Labor's achievements of its first three months in office.
