When you issued Clive Palmer's nickel refinery a new permit, you led the public to believe that you were acting in the best interest of the environment and the Great Barrier Reef World Heritage Area. Now, it's clear you weakened protections, by allowing waste of higher toxicity and approving two creek mouths as discharge points.

It doesn't matter that the permit "provides clear, unambiguous, enforceable conditions that must be met." The conditions are so weak that the refinery's discharges of toxic sludge this week are unlikely to even breach these limits.

According to the report by the The Australian, Federal government scientists have described a major discharge from the dams to the ecosystem of Halifax Bay as "similar to the daily discharge of treated sewage from a city of seven million people". How can you possibly allow this to happen in our World Heritage Area.


